

# GOP COMMITTEE MAPS STRATEGY

New Group Hopes to Roll Up One of Largest Votes In History.

The newly organized county Republican campaign policy committee, at its first meeting yesterday, outlined strategy intended to "roll up the biggest G. O. P. vote majority in the history of local elections."

Headed by Guy A. Wainwright, manufacturer, the committee announced it would conduct weekly conferences until the Nov. 7 election to advise the G. O. P. central committee on campaign maneuvers.

Mr. Wainwright issued the following statement on general policy:

"The committee has begun its duties with a real sense of its great public responsibility. While its first concern is to assure a large majority for Thomas Dewey, the committee recognizes that Mr. Dewey's administration can be successful only if he is supported by Republicans in other important offices. It is, therefore, the aim of the committee to elect the entire ticket by a margin that will leave no doubt about the temper of the people of Marion county."

Membership of the committee, besides Mr. Wainwright, is composed of representatives of both City hall and regular organization Republicans—Mayor Robert H. Tyndall, Charles A. Huff, chairman of the City hall Victory Committee; Joseph Daniels, former 11th district chairman, and Henry E. Ostrom, county committee chairman.

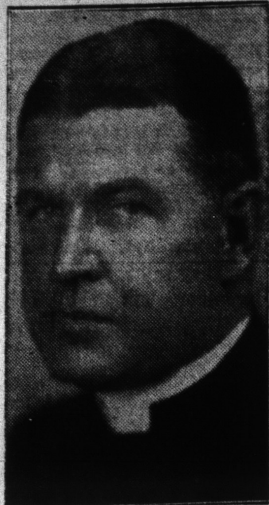

## NOVENA HONORS FRENCH SAINT

Church of Little Flower To Commemorate St. Therese of Lisieux.

The 19th annual novena in honor of St. Therese of Lisieux will be held from Monday, Sept. 25, through Oct. 3 at the Church of the Little Flower, 14th st. and Bosart ave. Services will be held at 8 o'clock nightly and the solemn close will be marked by the Feast day of St. Therese, the Little Flower of Jesus, Oct. 3.

The novena was instituted following organization of the Little Flower parish, honoring St. Therese of Lisieux, a young girl saint born in Alencon, France. She was declared a saint in 1925, 28 years after her death.

The Rev. Albert A. Murray of the Paulist Fathers of Chicago will conduct the services, which consist of the recitation of the rosary, sermon, novena prayers, prayers for peace and those in service, and benediction of the most blessed sacrament.

Several relics of the Little Flower will be offered for the veneration of people attending the novena. High mass will be offered each morning and special services will be conducted at 3 p. m. daily for children, and those unable to attend evening services.

## Ration Calendar

MEAT—Red stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through G5 in Book 4 good indefinitely for 10 points each.

SUGAR—Stamps 30, 31, 32 and 33 in Book 4 are good indefinitely for 5 pounds. Stamp 40 in Book 4 good for 5 pounds of canning sugar. No one is eligible for additional home canning sugar except those who produce for sale.

Applicants applying for canning sugar should send in one spare stamp 37, attached to the application for each applicant.

CANNED GOODS—Blue stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through L5 in Book 4 good indefinitely for 10 points each.

Blue tokens expire Sept. 30. Between Sept. 17 and Sept. 30 tokens can be used only in multiples of 10.

SHOES—No. 1 and No. 2 "airplane" stamps in Book 3 good indefinitely.

GASOLINE—Stamp A-12 is good for 3 gallons and expires Thursday, B3, B4 and B5 and C3, C4 and C5 good for 5 gallons; T (3d quarter) good for 5 gallons through Sept. 30; E, E1 and E2 good for 1 gallon; R, R1 and R2 are good for 5 gallons but are not valid at filling stations. Consumer may exchange R for E at his local board to purchase non-highway gasoline.

Registration for new A books will be held today and tomorrow at public school houses.

FUEL OIL—Period 4 and 5 coupons valid through Aug. 31, 1945. All change-making coupons and reserve coupons are now good. Period 1 good immediately.

TIRES—Commercial vehicle tire inspection every six months or every 5000 miles. Inspection certificates on passenger automobiles needed for replacement tires. B card holders are now eligible for grade 1 tires if they can prove extreme necessity. All A holders are eligible for grade 3 tires, including factory seconds, if they find tires which may be purchased.

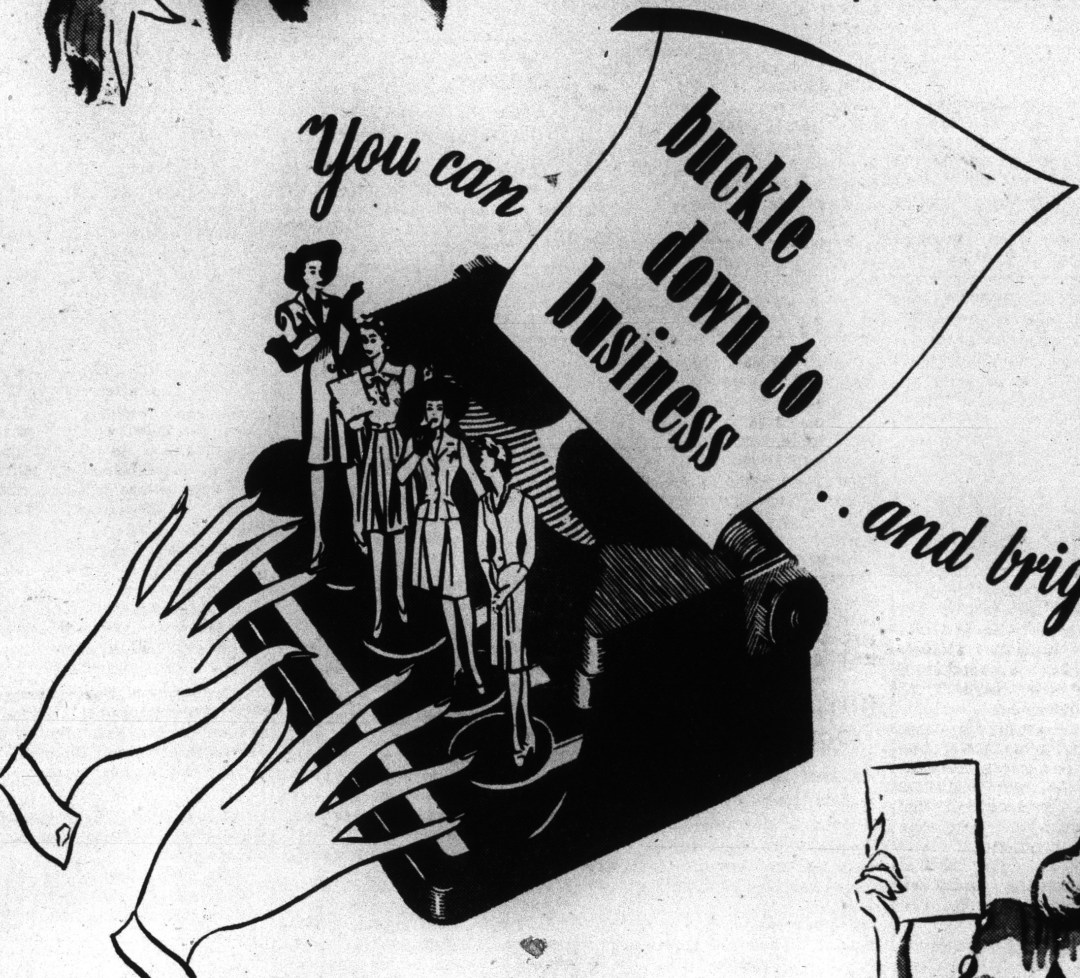
