DEAR JANE JORDAN—I am a young girl 22 years old. A year and a half ago I met a man and we were engaged. In the end I made a mistake with him which is a black mark on my life which never will be entirely erased. Now my problem is that my family does not think I should go out with other men. I have paid for that mistake in tears, sorrow and money and I am trying to live a Christian life. I work, pay board and buy my own clothes.

Can you see any reason why I should not have men friends as women friends? HURT.

Answer—I see no reason whatever why you should not have men friends. You are much safer than a less experienced girl would be. You are 22 years old. There is no reason for you to live alone in sackcloth and ashes or become an embittered old maid because you made one mistake. You are earning your own living and are not subject to orders from your frightened family. Stand up for yourself.

DEAR JANE JORDAN—My grandmother is now 83 and we have taken care of her for about 20 years. Don't you think it would be fair for some of the rest of the children to take care of her? One of mother's sisters is taking care of her now and she wants us to take her back. Mother's other sister said

she would take care of her but was in an accident and isn't able. We tried to get her in a nursing home but they are full up. She is so contrary that no one can live with her and we don't know what to do. BETTY

Answer—After 20 years no one can say that your mother hasn't done her part. Let the sister who has the care of her now hold on until other arrangements can be made. Your second aunt may recover, or if you keep your name on the waiting list, eventually there will be an opening in some nursing home. It is only fair for all children to share in the care of the old.
