Hoosier Heroes: Lewis, Bryson, Wangelin Killed; 4 Wounded and 1 Missing Listed

Sgt. J. Bernard Lewis, son of Mr. and Mrs. Hyman Lewis, 4343 Winthrop ave., was killed Aug. 5 in France, his parents have been informed. Sgt. Lewis was reported missing in a telegram received by the parents Aug. 21 and his status was changed two weeks later.

The 25-year-old soldier was a member of an armored division and had been overseas since January. He entered the service in April, 1942.

Sgt. Lewis formerly was employed as a salesman by the International Shoe Co. He was a graduate of Shortridge high school, and attended public school No. 70.

Surviving are the parents and a brother, Sgt. Joe Lewis, who is en route overseas.

Pvt. Virgil V. Bryson, husband of Mrs. Leila Bryson, 1328 S. Richland and son of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Bryson, 3412 S. Dexter st., was killed Sept. 1 in France after serving overseas two weeks.

The infantryman was 27. He graduated from Washington high school and was employed by the Chevrolet Commercial Body Co. of General Motors Corp., before entering the service in January. He was a member of Odd Fellows Lodge No. 658.

Surviving are the wife and parents: a son, Gerald Richard Bryson, 5; a brother, Everett; a sister, Mrs. Lucille Dishman, all of Indianapolis and the grandfather, M. F. Eaden, Kentucky.

Lt. James H. Wangelin, son of Mr. and Mrs. R. D. Wangelin, 1304 Edwards ave., was killed Sept. 2 in France after serving overseas since June.

The officer, who was 21, was assigned to the 56th field artillery battalion in Normandy and Brittany. He entered the reserve corps while a pre-medical student at Indiana university and was called to active duty Nov. 11, 1942, at his own request. He was commissioned July 30, 1943, at Ft. Sill, Okla.

Lt. Wangelin graduated from Technical high school and was an Eagle Scout and Firecracker. He was a member of the I. U. Marching 100 and the band fraternity.

Surviving are the parents: a brother, William R., in air force radio school at Reno, Nev., and his maternal grandmother, Mrs. W. R. Covertor, of the Edwards add.

Lt. Charles L. Ingels, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Ingels, Davis Rd., near Brookville rd., is missing after action with the marine air corps Sept. 2.

Lt. Ingels had been overseas only three weeks. A pilot on a bomber, he failed to return from a mission
