LOCAL CONCERN OFFERS STOCK

Electronic Laboratories to Sell 150,000 Shares of Common.

Public offering was made yesterday of 150,000 shares of common stock of Electronic Laboratories, Inc., of Indianapolis, at \$5 a share.

Proceeds from the sale of 100,000 shares will add \$500,000 to the company's working capital, that amount representing the net after expenses and discounts to the underwriters.

Proceeds from the sale of the remaining 50,000 shares will go to Norman R. Kevers, president, and William W. Garstang, vice president. Mr. Kevers will receive \$100,000 for the 27,000 shares of the 108,000 he owned, while Mr. Garstang will receive \$92,000 for the 23,000 of the 88,000 shares he owned, not including the 4000 owned with his wife.

Increases Credit

The offering was made through Bralson & Co., and Shillinglaw, Crowder & Co., Inc., of Chicago, and associates.

The company, which owns one plant at 122 W. New York st., and leases two others, manufactures vibrator power supplies, lighting equipment and radio communications equipment.

It had \$131,186 net profit in 1941 on sales of \$1,334,496; \$74,190 profit on sales of \$2,701,090 in 1942; \$181,609 profit on sales of \$7,268,487 in 1943; and \$74,366 net profit on sales of \$2,460,461 in the first five months of this year.

The sale will increase the credit available under the company's "V" loan agreement with the American National Bank & Trust Co. of Chicago and the Indiana National bank of Indianapolis from \$1,000,000 to \$1,500,000. There will be 100,000 more shares of the \$1 par value common stock authorized but unissued.

REPORT BURNING OF DUTCH VILLAGE

The Aneta news agency reported from London today that the Dutch village of Potten, 12 miles north of Apeldoorn, was burned by the Germans in reprisal for the refusal of Dutchmen to dig German defense works.

The Germans shot 30 men on the streets of Apeldoorn, the agency said, and the remainder of the male population went into hiding after a similar refusal to work for the Nazis.

ARMED YOUTH ROBS THEATER

Granada Cashier Forced to Give Up Funds at Gun Point.

Youthful hoodlums last night held up the Granada theater cashier shortly after the dinner hour and an East side man an hour later. An attempted burglary was frustrated when the victim awoke and ducked a small radio thrown at him by the burglar, who escaped.

A teen-aged boy pointed a revolver at Miss Dorothy Bowley, 16, of 1415 Barth ave., cashier at the theater, about 7:20 p. m. After taking \$25, he ran down the street, apparently unobserved.

A. C. Edwards, 1819 Commerce ave., was held up near 12th and Sterling sts. about 8:30 p. m. by two youths. When Edwards showed he had no billfold, he was searched and some loose change taken.

A tall burglar threw a table-model radio at Orville LaFollette, 1125 S. Kenwood ave., when the latter surprised him trying to remove it. The intended victim ducked and last saw the burglar dashing out the front door.

Capture Weather Base in Greenland

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12 (U. P.).—Capture of another German weather station in Greenland, which was presumed to have been a year ago, was disclosed yesterday by army air force sources which said that 12 Germans and quantities of radio and other technical equipment were seized.

A navy spokesman revealed later that the capture, made last week, was carried out by members of a coast guard cutter.

The Greenland area is a "weather factory" for Europe. Weather which moves into Europe makes up there.

Hence, capture of the station believed to be the last German one on the huge Arctic island—deprives the Germans of a valuable outpost for gathering weather data that would be useful in planning German aerial actions.

The latest seizure was the third in three years.

A class of candidates will be inducted at the meeting. Guest speaker for the program will be Frank Martino.

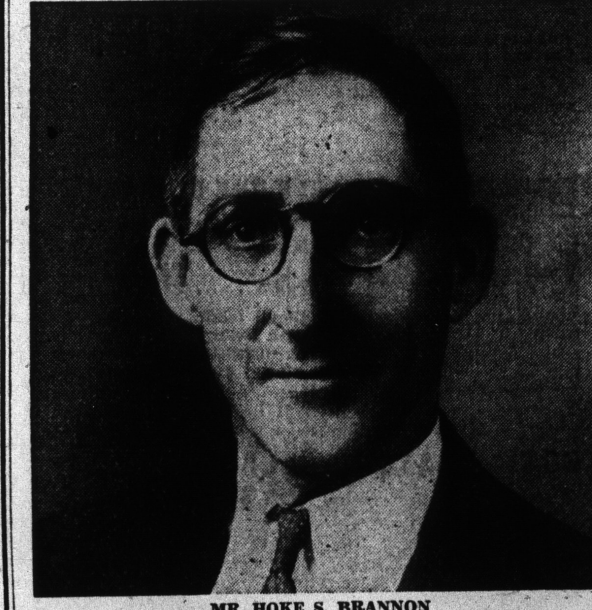

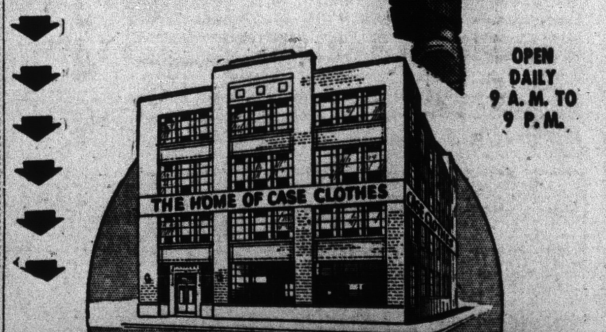
