WALLACE DUE HERE SATURDAY

Radio Talk and Luncheon to
Be Followed by Other
State Addresses.

One of the biggest Democratic splashes of the campaign will come this week-end with the arrival in Indianapolis of Vice President Henry A. Wallace Saturday morning for a radio address and luncheon at the Claypool hotel.

State Democratic Chairman Fred P. Bays announced that Mr. Wallace will arrive here about 7:45 a. m. Saturday for a breakfast with party leaders, followed by a press conference and reception.

At 10:45 a. m. the vice president is scheduled to make a short radio address over WIRE followed by a luncheon in the Chateau foot.

From here he is scheduled to go to Anderson for another reception and radio address and later to Muncie for a dinner address which will be broadcast over Muncie's WIBC and over WIBC, Indianapolis.

Sunday Mr. Wallace will deliver a major campaign address at Gary following a dinner meeting.

FDR ASKS SOUND TRADE SYSTEM

U. S. Must Co-operate for
Its Own Salvation, He
Tells Conclave.

NEW YORK, Oct. 12 (U. P.).—President Roosevelt said last night that the U. S. for its own salvation must co-operate with other like-minded nations in establishing a sound and equitable system of commercial and economic relationships among all countries.

In a message to the final session of the 31st National Foreign Trade council convention, Mr. Roosevelt emphasized that "a vigorous and expanding international trade is indispensable to such a system."

He pointed out that the "opportunity for the citizens of every country to trade with the citizens of other countries, fairly and without unnecessary and uneconomic restrictions, and without discrimination, oppression or aggression, is essential to world economic security and therefore to world peace."

Army Exemplifies Simple Language

LONDON, Oct. 12 (U. P.).—The war office wishes its staff would use simpler language in official documents, such as "end" instead of "termination" and "help" instead of "facilitate."

It adjured them to that effect yesterday in these terms:

"Nothing is more conducive to long-winded and stilted writing than the use of a formal, pedantic or polysyllabic substitute for a natural word or expression."

Johnston Gives Views

1. "The absolute necessity for a vastly expanded post-war trade among nations. The U. S. and many other countries of the world must raise their sights to what would have been previously considered fantastic heights."

2. "If there is going to be a large volume of foreign trade, we must have a more prosperous people. You can't sell goods to the penniless or the bankrupt. Nor do bare hands produce much wealth."

3. "A strong, prosperous, a free America."
