Times Columnist Chosen
"Best All-Around Wash-
ington Correspondent."

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12 (U. P.) — Thomas L. Stokes, Indianapolis Times columnist, was chosen by a group of Washington newspapermen as the capital correspondent who "does the best all-around job measured in terms of reliability, fairness and ability to analyze news," it was announced today.

Mr. Stokes received 25 votes while Marquis Childs, United Feature syndicate columnist, was second with 23. Bert Andrews, New York Herald Tribune, and Roscoe Drummond, Christian Science Monitor, tied for third place with eight votes each.

The New York Times was selected as the newspaper maintaining the best all-around Washington news service as measured by reliability, comprehensiveness and fairness.

The selection was made in a poll conducted by the Saturday Review of Literature. Questionnaires were sent to 696 members of the congressional press gallery and 160 answers were received.

The New York Times received 85 votes for the best Washington news service. The Washington Post with 16 votes was second, followed by the New York Herald Tribune with 14 and the Baltimore Sun with 9.

Pearson Tops Vote

Arthur Krock, chief of the New York Times Washington bureau, was selected by 51 voters as "the Washington correspondent who exerts through his writings the greatest influence on Washington." Drew Pearson, author of the United Feature syndicate's Washington Merry-Go-Round, was second with 32 votes and Walter Lippmann, New York Herald Tribune columnist, was third with 19 votes.

Pearson received 56 votes as the Washington columnist exerting through his writings the greatest influence on the nation. Lippmann was second with 28 votes and Krock third with 13.

The Chicago Tribune, with 65 votes, was chosen as "the newspaper which is the most flagrant in angling or weighing the news to suit its own editorial opinions." The Washington Times-Herald received 34 votes to take second place in the category, and the New York newspaper PM was third with 29 votes.


Seven Students at Butler University Have Parents on Faculty Staff
