Ballet Russe Offers Enchanting and Colorful Performance at the Murat

By JEAN KERCHEVAL The Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo opened a two-day stand at the Murat last night, reminding its fans that ballet is one of the most enchanting and colorful of the arts.

The Soviet ballet, "The Red Poppy," opened the performance with a more serious mood than the compositions which followed it, "Dances Concertantes" and "Gaites Parisiennes."

Nathalie Krassovska danced the part of the Chinese cabaret entertainer who, through the love and aid of a Russian sailor, overcomes the Japanese proprietor who persecutes her.

The rollicking Russian sailors' dance in the third act, led by Yurek Lazovska, who played opposite Miss Krassovska, pointed up the versatility of ballet.

"Dances Concertantes" is an abstract ballet of sheer delight and beauty choreographed by George Balanchine to Igor Stravinsky's music. The choreography is of a

more traditional type than the other ballets, with Alexandra Danilova and Frederic Franklin in the lead. This ballet was presented for the first time this year.

Miss Krassovska again was the prima ballerina in "Gaites Parisiennes," a light and pleasant farce of the Paris of Jacques Offenbach's day. Mr. Offenbach composed the music for this ballet and the choreography was by Leonide Massine.

Performances are scheduled this afternoon and tonight.

G. I. Center to Open—A CAMPAIGN to enlist the 3500 municipal employees as donors to the Red Cross blood bank was started by department heads after hearing a talk by Chief Petty Officer George C. Stumpf Jr., former city fireman.

Chief Stumpf described how his life was saved by three gallons of blood plasma after more than two-thirds of his body was burned while fighting a blaze aboard a naval vessel.

The county's official G. I. employment center will be opened next week in Room 230, K. of P. building.

Plant to Remain—THE NAVAL ORDINANCE plant out at 21st and Arlington, now operated for the navy by the Lukas-Harold Corp., has been made a permanent part of the navy's shore establishment and will be continued here after the war.

This good news was announced by the commanding officer at the plant, Warren Gladding, who has just been raised from the rank of commander to captain.

At present the plant is reported turning out the Norden bombsight and various fire control devices.
