Park Head Agrees to Waive Fees for Community Houses

Park Superintendent Paul V. supposedly is supported by tax levy. Brown today said his department will not charge civic and non-profit organizations for use of community houses.

He also asserted that should fee-charges on other city recreation facilities be considered in the future, the issue will be "taken up with every community group in town."

His statement followed the mass protest last night at city council of a large delegation of Brookside Civic league members against rental fees on the use of community houses.

Council Delays Vote
A civic league ordinance proposing to exempt from community house fees all "charitable, civic, social or recreational" groups, was postponed by council on the theory that the measure's generalities might have the legal effect of eliminating present charges on golf courses and swimming pools.

Complaints registered by civic league spokesmen emphasized that additional charges for recreational facilities is a "double tax" abuse, since the municipal play program from Tokyo.



Mourned Here



Dr. Dunkel's Rites Set for Thursday; Burial in Ohio

Services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Thursday at Napoleon, O., for Dr. Joel Ambrose Dunkel, former pastor of the Tabernacle Presbyterian church here 22 years. Burial will be at Tiffin, O.

Dr. Dunkel, who was 73, died yesterday at Chicago. He had been ill several weeks.

He came to the Tabernacle church in 1918 and during his stay here won a national reputation through his administration of the affairs of the church. He was a former moderator of the Indiana synod and later was considered for moderator of the national assembly of the Presbyterian church in 1928.

Starts Building Fund

Dr. Dunkel was a member of the general council of the church and also was a trustee of Princeton university's theological seminary.

Shortly after coming here, he began collection of a building fund that resulted in erection of the Tabernacle structure, one of the finest in the Midwest. At the time of his death, Dr. Dunkel was pastor of the home at 5315 N. Delaware st.

His wife, Elizabeth, survives him.


