

HAILS DEWEY AS RESTORING HOPE

Michigan Chief Says New Yorker Is 'Free of Any Promises.'

With the election of Governor Thomas E. Dewey next Tuesday, "the face of America will once more be turned toward a future bright with hope," Governor Harry F. Kelly of Michigan said here last night in a speech before a Marion county G. O. P. organization meeting in the Claypool hotel.

The Michigan Governor told the cheering party workers that Governor Dewey would go into the White House "free of any pledges, promises or commitments, express or implied."

"Communism and Americanism never will mix," Governor Kelly said. "If Hillman and Browder win, they'll think they have the right to dictate labor's policies."

Raps 'Inexperience' Charge

He said that the Democratic cry of "inexperience" in connection with Governor Dewey "would be amusing if it were not so unfair."

"Governor Dewey's name was on the lips of the nation while we were still deep in the trough of the Roosevelt depression," he said. "Before we entered the war, he had made a record as a public servant which won him universal acclaim."

"The program of Governor Dewey and the Republican party is the hope of America. Anyone comparing the declarations of the two presidential candidates is struck by the discouragement and cynicism of one, the courage and faith of the other."

'Repudiates One-Man Rule'

"In the first place, Governor Dewey repudiates the doctrine of one-man government. He has clearly indicated that his administration will operate as a team. He has pledged that, upon his election to

TEXAS U. FIRES ITS PRESIDENT

Former Head of Franklin College Is Ousted by Board of Regents.

HOUSTON, Tex., Nov. 2 (U. P.).—The University of Texas at Austin was in the market today for a president less given to speech making. The board of regents fired Dr. Homer P. Rainey last night in a stormy session.

Three members of the board resigned in protest. Angered by Mr. Rainey's recent statement charging them with 16 acts which he said were "repressive measures," hampering his administration at the university, the regents discharged him as unco-operative.

'Too Many Speeches'

One regent accused Mr. Rainey of making too many speeches before religious organizations. Dr. T. S. Painter, a professor of zoology, was named acting president.

Mr. Rainey discredited the theory of a superior race and struck out at large corporate wealth in a recent speech at Christ church in New York. He came to the University of Texas in 1939 from Washington, D. C., where he was director of the American Youth commission.

FRANKLIN, Ind., Nov. 2 (U. P.).

—Dr. Homer Price Rainey, who was ousted last night as president of the University of Texas, once was president of Franklin college and at that time was known as "the youngest college president in the U. S." Rainey headed the small Baptist institution at the age of 31, for four years between 1927 and 1931. He left to become president of Bucknell university, Lewisburg, Pa.
