Dewey Rips FDR's 'Cynical Alliance' With Communists

that must approve the terms and scope of our participation in this world effort to maintain peace. In the working out of that program there must be mutual confidence and teamwork between the President and congress.

Stresses Teamwork

"If we are not to run the grave danger of seeing this whole program wrecked on the rock of one man's arbitrary will, we must install next Jan. 20 an administration that wants to work with congress, that knows how to work with congress, and that deserves the confidence of the people and their elected representatives.

"My opponent has consistently abused the members of congress so that today an irrevocable breach exists between the executive and legislative branches of our government. That breach began with the arrogant attempt to pack the supreme court. It was widened by the attempt to purge those members of congress that resisted the President's will and defended the constitution. It has deepened year after year until it flared in open revolt this year.

More Clever Than Honest

"You remember how, on Washington's birthday, my opponent sent to the congress a veto message so savage that his own majority leader, Senator Barkley, rose to denounce the words of that message as 'more clever than honest' and as 'a calculated and deliberate assault upon the legislative integrity of every member of congress'.

"The other senators, regardless of party, rallied around Senator Barkley's declaration of independence and the members of the house crowded into the senate chamber to shake his hand.

"Yet, not content with having alienated the leaders of his own party, Mr. Roosevelt only last Friday night accused the Republicans who will be the new leaders of congress of placing political advantage above devotion to country just because they publicly pledged themselves to a program for lasting peace.

From Baltimore, Mr. Dewey goes

to Scranton and Wilkes Barre, Pa., for evening appearances. None of his three talks today were being broadcast.

'Cynical Alliance'

His Boston speech last night was the strongest denunciation he had made of the "cynical alliance" which, he told 25,000 persons in strongly Catholic Boston, the New Deal has entered into "with Earl Browder's Communists." He charged that the alliance was effected through Sidney Hillman and his Political Action Committee. Lashing out with the bitterest personal denunciation of President Roosevelt since the campaign began, Mr. Dewey charged that "Mr. Roosevelt, in his growing desire to perpetuate himself in office for 16 years, has put his party on the auction block—for sale to the highest bidder."

Freedoms in Jeopardy

He said the highest bidder were "the Political Action Committee of Sidney Hillman and the Communists of Earl Browder."

Mr. Dewey charged that President Roosevelt has "so weakened and corrupted the Democratic party that it is readily subject to capture" and "the forces of Communism are, in fact, now capturing it."

"The Communists are seizing control of the New Deal, through which they aim to control the government of the United States," Governor Dewey shouted. "If they should succeed, the fundamental freedoms of every American would stand in gravest jeopardy."

As an example of what he meant, Mr. Dewey painted the Communist system as one under which "the individual cannot worship, vote or think as he would, or conduct his life as his own." The price for disobedience, he declared, "is liquidation, either through violence or slow economic strangulation."

Attacks Hillman, Browder

The G. O. P. candidate leveled a similar personal attack against Browder and Hillman. Of Browder he said:

"He is the man who was convicted of draft dodging in the last war. He was again convicted—this time of perjury—and pardoned by Franklin Roosevelt in time to organize the fourth term campaign. Browder stands for everything that would destroy America."

He described Hillman as a labor leader who had held "one official post after another in the New Deal" and "a front for the Communists" in the fourth term campaign.

Mr. Dewey warned against any ignoring of "the Communist threat because of their small numbers."

'Fanatical Conspiracy'

"They are not themselves a political party," he asserted. "They are a fanatical, secret conspiracy of well-disciplined, highly trained zealots who work at their purposes every hour of the day. Falsehood, deception and smear propaganda are part of their technique. . . . They place their members at strategic points where they can seize control of large organizations."

Similarly, he argued that the "New Deal is not a political party" but "has become a collection of warring factions, tied together only by a consuming passion for power."

Mr. Dewey accused "New Dealers" of attempting to evade discussion of communism in the presidential campaign.

Doomed to Failure

He predicted that any Communist bid for control of the American government is doomed to failure.

Describing the P. A. C. fee of \$1 per member as "this Roosevelt poll tax imposed by Sidney Hillman," Mr. Dewey said working men and women are "rising in protest all over the nation."

The solution, he continued, lies in voting for the Republican party "in the secrecy of the voting booth." "That danger (communism) can be surely met only by ending a situation which leaves vast power in tired hands," he argued. "The Republican party is not perfect. But one thing at least is sure: Neither the Communist group which Mr. Roosevelt professed to repudiate nor any other totalitarianism group is making an effort to capture the Republican party. They know how useless it would be."

He predicted that "millions of Democrats are voting Republican this year to save their own party and their country."

Highlights of Dewey's Address Given in Boston

BOSTON, Nov. 2 (U. P.).—Highlights from the address of Governor Thomas E. Dewey here last night:

"Once in every four years, late in October, my opponent announces that he believes in the enterprise system. Then for the remaining three years and 11 months, he wages war against the American enterprise system day in and day out."

"By installing a fresh and united administration in Washington, the day of total victory and the return of our fighting men will be speeded up greatly."

"With a government in which the President works in harmony and mutual respect with the congress, we can unite America for effective world leadership in a world organization for lasting peace."

"They (the Communists) are a

fanatical, secret conspiracy of well-disciplined, highly trained zealots who work at their purposes every hour of the day. Falsehood, deception and smear propaganda are parts of their technique."

"Now, by the self-same tried and familiar tactics with the aid of Sidney Hillman, the Communists are seizing control of the New Deal through which they aim to control the government of the United States. If they should succeed, the fundamental freedoms of every American would stand in gravest jeopardy."

"Sidney Hillman has become the biggest political boss in the United States."

"Mr. Roosevelt, in his overwhelming desire to perpetuate himself in office for 16 years, has put his party on the auction block—for sale to the highest bidder."

SAYS HEAD WOUNDS CAUSE OF EPILEPSY

CHICAGO, Nov. 2 (U. P.).—Epilepsy is the most serious aftermath of bullet or shell fragment wounds which penetrate the skull.

It may develop as long as 20 years after the injury, Dr. Ernest Sachs of St. Louis, told the Institute of Medicine of Chicago at its post-graduate assembly on war and post-war neurological problems today.

Epilepsy occurs more frequently after war wounds than after civilian injuries to the head, Sachs said.

It is an "unsolved problem," he added. "We do not know definitely how frequently it occurs, how to recognize the cases that are going to develop and how best to deal with them."

After the first world war, Sachs said, the British discovered that at the end of one year about 2 per cent of the men injured in the head became epileptic; at the end of five years the ratio increased to 10 or 15 per cent and now a final follow-up reports the incidence of epilepsy to be 34 per cent.

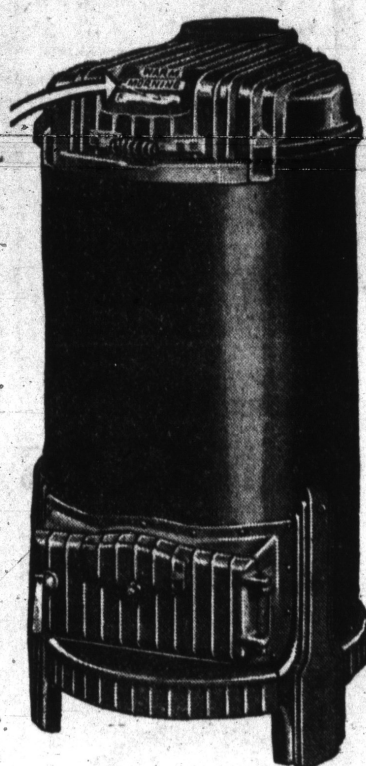
However, he said that better control of infection by the use of sulfonamides and penicillin may aid in reducing the number of cases after the present war.
