## A. A. U. W. Branch Sponsors 12th Annual Book and Toy Exhibit

SANTA CLAUS has heard of salvage drives, too. Evidence of this crops up at the 12th annual book and toy exhibit being held this week in Ayres' auditorium under the sponsorship of the Indianapolis branch, American Association of University Women.

A few of St. Nick's handmade toys contrived from salvage materials include a train of wooden crates, tin cans and spools, a doll house made of facial tissue boxes, and a loom from a discarded cigar box, nails and string.

Wholesome toys that cannot injure, or that children themselves can make are featured in the exhibit. Toys for children of all ages can be found there. New things of interest for babies are a musical chair, wringer dolls which can be washed and passed through a wringer, and a Kangaroo pouch to throw things "into" instead of "out of."

with an appropriate setting for the doll, cover it with cellophane and hang it on the wall like a picture. The book booth has books for

everything and everyone. Explanatory book exhibits are also placed with the other booths. A chart showing recommended radio programs is displayed with this group. Constructive hobbies as well as collective ones are emphasized at the hobby booth. Things children can make for Christmas such as pins of wool, nuts and wood, dolls of crepe paper and animals are on display.

THE FINAL group features outdoor fun. Suggested amusements for children in this section include bird hikes, an afternoon at the Children's museum, camping trips, ice skating and tobogganing. A map of the city showing places for winter sports may be found at this booth.

Other features of the exhibit include a talk and demonstration on "Flying as a Hobby" by Miss Panofia Apostol at 4 p. m. Thursday and a nature motion picture at 10:30 a. m. Saturday.
