

State Fraternal Congress Opens 46th Annual Parley

Delegates from 42 organizations affiliated with the Indiana Fraternal Congress assembled here today for the 46th annual parley of the congress at Hotel Lincoln.



The assembly this morning heard the first principal address by Mrs. Grace W. McCurdy, a leader in fraternal circles for the past 30 years and a past president of the National Fraternal Congress.

Mrs. McCurdy, who holds the post of supreme

oracle of the Royal Neighbors of America, Rock Island, Ill., spoke on "Forward With Fraternal Insurance."

The annual banquet will be held tonight at the Hotel Lincoln, with Mayor Tyndall scheduled to deliver the address of welcome. A. L. Zivich, past president of the Indiana Congress, will give the response and Arthur Sapp, Huntington, member of the legislative committee, will deliver the principal address.
