BRITISH SPAN COSINA SOUTHEAST OF AENZA

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24 (U. P.)—Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson hinted yesterday that the national guard might be the source of American troops that would be used by the proposed United Nations organization to maintain future peace and thwart any aggressor.

Asserting at his news conference that the war department approves of a plan to continue the national guard after the war as a component of the U. S. army, he said:

"It would be the mission of this reserve component, in the event of a national emergency, to furnish units fit for service anywhere in the world."

He declined to say whether this meant that the reserve component would be utilized as part of an international police force.

A community described the fighting as "very bitter" with the Germans throwing in infantry, artillery, mortars and machine guns.
