Ruth Posselt Is Acclaimed

Plays Dvorak's Concerto With Symphony.

Violinist Ruth Posselt's brilliant interpretation of Antonin Dvorak's "Concerto for Violin in A-Minor" highlighted the Indianapolis symphony orchestra's first pair of concerts this year.

The concerts, presented Saturday night and yesterday afternoon, were predominantly middle European in temperament. They featured colorful compositions by two Czech composers, Dvorak and Smetana, and Wagner, the German, and Liszt the Hungarian.

Miss Posselt left no doubt in the minds of her audiences that she manages her instrument beautifully. Dvorak, who probably is the Czech composer with whom Americans are most familiar, instills in this concerto an intensely nationalistic spirit. This performance was its first in Indianapolis. He himself made a precarious living as a professional violinist and his concerto for violin ably expresses the emotional depth and tenderness and the revolutionary spirit of his people.

Give 'Siegfried Idyll'

"The Moldau," by another Czech composer, Friedrich Smetana, who has been called "The father of Bohemian music," was especially well presented by Fabien Sevititzky and the orchestra.

Smetana's patriotic interpretation of Czech history, legends, scenery and customs by relating the course of the country's principal river, is full of contrasting somberness and gaiety.

"The Moldau" is the second of six symphonic poems which make up Smetana's cycle "My Country." His best known work is his opera, "The Bartered Bride."

Following intermission, Richard Wagner's "A Siegfried Idyll" was performed by the orchestra. The "Idyll" is more subdued than most of Wagner's dramatic compositions, but it is one of his most popular works.

Henry Kimball Hadley's "In Bohemia" opened the program which was closed by Franz Liszt's "Les Preludes."

An American composer, Hadley's overture is dedicated to Victor Herbert and refers to "that unsubstantial domain in which true artists dwell."

'Rebecca' Opens Tonight at 8:45

The stage version of Daphne Du Maurier's best seller, "Rebecca," will open at English's at 8:45 o'clock tonight for a three-day stand.

Bramwell Fletcher, Florence Reed and Diana Barrymore are the featured members of the cast in the roles of Maxim de Winter, Mrs. Danvers and the second Mrs. de Winter respectively.

The play is Miss Du Maurier's own dramatization of her novel which telescopes the book into three acts and six scenes.

In the supporting cast are Margaret Bannerman, George Baxter, Franklin Fox, Claude Horton, Reginald Mason, Richard Temple, Jacqueline Max, Kenneth Treseder and Edgar Kent.
