PAN-AMERICAN EXPERT BOOKED

Correspondent Allen Haden
On Town Hall Program
Here Tomorrow.

Allen Haden, South American
correspondent for the Chicago Daily
News, will speak on "The United
States and Its American Neighbors"
at 11 a.m. tomorrow in the
Town Hall series at English's.

Mr. Haden, born in Klang-
yin, China, of missionary
parents, has lived in
several foreign countries. At the
time of world war I he lived with
his family in Switzerland. After the death of his
father he and his mother went to
France, where he first learned English
from the American expeditionary
forces.

He went to school in Spain three
years and then went back to
Switzerland. His education was
completed in the United States.

In Foreign Service

He took examinations for foreign
service and held posts in Genoa,
Italy; Madrid, Singapore and
Buenos Aires. He was made secretary
of the American delegation to
the Chaco peace conference during
his work at Buenos Aires.

Resigning from the government
service in 1940 to organize the
Diplomatic News Service, Mr. Haden
covered the Havana consultative
conference of American foreign
ministers for El Mundo, a Buenos
Aires newspaper. Since 1940 he
has been Latin American corre-
spondent for the Chicago Daily
News.

Alvin E. Orion, head of the As-
sociated Press here, will introduce
Mr. Haden tomorrow and will pre-
side at the luncheon following the
lecture in the Columbia club.
