## SENATE O. K.'S HOSPITAL BILL

New Institution Planned for  
Diagnosis of Mental  
Illness.

A new half-million dollar hospital to be used primarily for diagnosis of mental illness will be built here, if a bill passed yesterday by the Indiana senate is approved by the house and signed by the governor.

The measure would provide for operation of the hospital in connection with the Indiana university school of medicine at an estimated annual cost of \$200,000.

The mental hospital would be the first attempt in this state to provide diagnostic service for "border-line" cases. Medical authorities declare that a high percentage of early mental ills are first indicated by personality quirks.

### Advice Available

Psychiatrists would be available also for consultation by those who personally recognize their inability to adjust themselves to their environment.

The senate also passed to third reading another bill establishing a study commission to select a location for an insane hospital in northern Indiana.

A total of \$200,000 was appropriated for this study and the preparation of plans. Originally, the measure had included provision for an appropriation of \$3,800,000 to erect a hospital. This, however, was eliminated in committee.

Her father, who was connected with Hotel Lincoln and Hotel Antlers, now is manager of the Hotel Baker in Dallas.



## STUDY CHANGES IN LIQUOR BILL

GOP Dissension in House

Shown During Caucus

Over Measure.

The administration's liquor bill today had split wide open the ranks of the Republican majority in the house of representatives.

During a caucus on provisions of the bill, several G. O. P. solons walked out and refused to be identified with the program after the leadership discussed several amendments to the measure.

They said they had agreed to:

ONE: Cut back the tavern closing hour to 11 p. m. on week days and midnight on Saturdays. Some legislators wanted taverns closed at 10 p. m.

TWO: Double the tax on whisky, raising it from \$1 to \$2 a gallon, compared to the bill's present provisions for a \$1.50 tax.

THREE: Ban the sale of alcoholic beverages on Memorial Day.

FOUR: Ignore demands of dry organizations for a local option clause in the bill to permit communities to outlaw liquor in their districts.

FIVE: Assess a \$10 license fee for all liquor salesmen and a \$1 fee for all bartenders and waitresses.

The bill in its present form would give the Republican administration complete control over the liquor and beer business by vesting power in the beverage commission to revoke permits without review by the courts.

The commission, although bi-partisan in structure, would be controlled by the administration by a provision in the bill to give the governor power to appoint the chairman who would have two votes.
