may exert a profound influence in future generations. It was a diplomat's dream—one of the events leading up to the San Francisco peace conference to be held on April 21.

9 Out of 20 Right

With this in mind, The Times put the query, "What is Dumbarton Oaks?" to a score of persons in every walk of life.

Those interrogated were chosen at random.

Of 20 quizzed, nine gave correct or near correct replies. Several confused Dumbarton Oaks with the war-and-peace parleys held by the Big Three.

One of those questioned, State Auditor A. V. Burch, proved to have much more than a passing acquaintance with Dumbarton Oaks.

"Why I slept there for three New Year's nights in a row," replied Mr. Burch, "It's a large building surrounded by many oak trees. It previously was owned by Col. Henry F. Blount of the Blount Plow Works in Evansville."

New Heads Plow Works

Mr. Burch now is president and owner of the Blount Plow Works. Not only had he been a guest in the house, but also was familiar with the place.

A public official whose name is known by practically all Indianapolis residents—"It's a place near Washington where the President met that little guy who wears the funny hats and smokes a cigar... What's his name? Oh, yes, Churchill."

A state office receptionist—"I believe it's a famous author."

A county official—"Where they drew up the program on the war situation. Dewey had a man there, but I forget his name now."

A downtown shoe shop operator—"Lemme see. By golly, that's the new style shoe leather they've got now, huh?"

A city department assistant—"A peace plan conference. Roosevelt met with Churchill and diplomats from 23 other allied nations."

Bartender in a downtown tavern—"Is that another one of those new-fangled mixed drinks?"

City clubwoman—"That's where they had the convention to draw up world peace plans. It's on the Hudson river somewhere, isn't it?"

Lady tobacco stand clerk—"A place in Canada where Roosevelt and Churchill met for the first time."

What It Is:

Among those who hit the nail on the head were two professional politicians, a rent-a-car manager, a clerk in an airline office and a downtown barber.

Dumbarton Oaks is an estate, one of the show places of residential Washington, D. C. It was there that international security talks got under way Aug. 21.

Representatives of the United States, Great Britain, Russia and China conferred on plans for preventing war and removing the causes of armed strife through peaceful settlement of economic issues. The parley closed on Oct. 9 with the blueprinting of extensive, detailed plans for world security.

Neither Roosevelt, Churchill or Stalin attended, but sent emissaries instead.

RECEIPT OFFERED AS ALIBI DEFENSE

Haupt has maintained that Mrs. Bell actually was admitted June 22. He was prepared to call several witnesses late today to prove the hospital records show this date.

The receipt for \$10 dated June 30 was admitted to evidence by Judge William D. Bain.

Witness Recalled

Another defense witness who testified previously was recalled to the stand.

Mrs. Verona McDougal, daughter of Mrs. Bell, identified the receipt and said it was given to her mother the day following her admittance June 29.

The state contends the receipt was given for a payment made eight days after the deceased woman's admittance and does not establish the date of admittance.

Defense plans to recall a previous state witness, Robert Haskins, were indefinite. Defense attorneys John O. Lewis and M. Wilson Beene had considered recalling Haskins to break down his previous testimony.

Haskins Being Held

Haskins has testified that he and his wife, Ora, were told by the defendant of his participation in the murder and of a leg injury received in the getaway. Haskins is being held at the county jail as a material witness.

The jury of 11 women and one man probably will be given the case tomorrow.

Highpoint in the testimony to date was reached yesterday when the defendant, De Graffenreid, denied steadfastly from the witness stand that he brutally beat to death the South side florist.

The latter and his wife were attacked by two men last June 30. Mrs. Wiedenhoft recovered and subsequently identified De Graffenreid as one of the two men who came to their home at 2260 S. Meridian st. the night of the murder.

Army Sends Grieving Parents Bloody Clothes of Dead Son

rived from the army service forces, Kansas City quartermaster depot, army effects bureau.

The mother opened it.

And for an hour she lay on the floor sobbing.

"There were the bloody clothes and the bowie knife he wore as he died," the mother said in a breaking voice.

"There were those muddy, sweaty, mouldy clothes. His shorts, his pants, his muddy, dirty socks pulled over the stiffened shoes and his shirt."

Shirt With Bloodstain

"His shirt with a long bloodstain running down the right side and on the sleeve."

The tremor in her voice was great, but the initial shock was gone.

"It was the most horrible, inhuman, brutal act in the world. It is the worst time we ever have gone through."

"I couldn't believe anyone could be so heartless as to send home that blood-soaked shirt. I couldn't make myself believe the brown stain was blood."

The mother scraped some brown flakes from the shirt to test.

It was the blood of her son shed on the battlefield.

"We decided to tell The Times of this act after reading Ruth Millett's article yesterday," she said.

(Miss Millett told of a Massachusetts mother who received her son's final pay check after he was killed in action. There was a laundry deduction of \$1.58.)

'A Horrible Shock'

"We have suffered a horrible shock. If we can but put a stop to this action we will feel we have done some small deed in saving other grieving parents the same experience," the mother said firmly.

Meanwhile, the father has written the effects bureau demanding an explanation of the action.

In another letter he has called upon Rep. Louis Ludlow for a congressional investigation.

He said: "If this is the gen-

eral action of the army, then it should stop."

Yesterday, almost a week after the package arrived, a letter came from the Kansas City bureau.

It said that a package was on the way and if not received in 30 days to ask that a tracer be sent out.

Replying to the letter, the parents were asked to refer to the correspondence number of 100611.

In part the letter read: "Personal property is transmitted by this bureau for distribution according to the laws of the state of the officer's legal residence."

YANKS CAPTURE PEAK IN ITALY BY STORM
