Hitler in Last Spiteful Act Gave Japs Weapon Secrets

PARIS, May 11.—Adolf Hitler gave the Japanese Germany's most jealously guarded secrets of technical and V-weapon warfare as one of the last of his spiteful savage crimes against western civilization.

Technical investigators for the American air force have uncovered an order, signed by Hitler himself, directing that every scrap of the latest information regarding radar, unearthed by the German electronics industry's researchers, be made instantly available to Nippon's scientists. In addition, German radar experts were ordered to make available to the Japs working models of the latest-type apparatus.

There is evidence that German and Japanese scientists have been in direct communication on radar and other technical subjects, but no one can say whether Hitler's order has been fully executed.

The order appears to have been issued at the time of our Rhine crossings, late in March. Before then Germany seems to have withheld from its Pacific ally the best and latest scientific discoveries.

If der Fuehrer's final spite command has been carried out, it could conceivably affect the future course of the Pacific war profoundly.

American naval radar, immeasurably superior to Jap radar, has contributed heavily to our superiority in that theater.

German radar, though behind both American and British radar, was fast catching up with ours when the European war ended.

SLAYER OF 6 GETS DEATH SENTENCE

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., May 11 (U.P.)—A 24-year-old former Little Rock taxi driver, James W. Hall, confessed slayer of six persons, was found guilty yesterday by a circuit court jury of the first degree murder of his wife, Mrs. Fayrene Hall, 19.

The verdict, reached by the jury in less than an hour's deliberation, automatically carries the death sentence.

However, it appeared certain that Hall's court-appointed attorney, M. V. Moody, would appeal the case to the Arkansas Supreme court.

Hall was said to have confessed to the slaying of his wife, two Negroes and three white men.






