

Tribe Bows To Brewers, Drops to 3d

MILWAUKEE, May 22.—The "war workers special" morning game between the Indianapolis Indians and the Milwaukee Brewers was postponed today because of rain. The Hoosiers moved on to St. Paul to open a series with the Apostles tomorrow.

MILWAUKEE, May 22.—The Indianapolis Indians and Milwaukee Brewers were carded for their fourth game of the series today, Manager Bill Burwell's pastimes needing a victory to square the set with the 1944 champions.

Milwaukee won last night's abbreviated contest, 4-4, after it was out to six innings by rain. The triumph enabled the Brewers to pass the Tribesmen in the standing, moving 14 percentage points in front of Indianapolis.

The Indians tagged Carl Lindquist for eight hits last night, including four for extra bases, but Milwaukee landed roughly on George Jeffcoat to gain the verdict. They potted out 11 safeties in four frames.

A triple by Art Parks and a single by Vince Shupe gave the Indians a lead in their half of the first and they added another in the third on Ben Geraghty's double and a hit by Bill Heitzel.

Brews Score in Third
Milwaukee got one of these back in the last of the third and put the game out of reach of the Hoosiers with a five-run rally in the fourth. A triple by Bill Norman, a hit batsman, singles by Al Biggs and Lew Flick and Bill Burgo's double plate four runs.

Gene Nance's single sent the fifth runner across and Pedro Jimenez replaced Jeffcoat. He fanned Norman to end the uprising.

Heitzel's scratch, a base on balls to Parks, an infield out and Shupe's double manufactured the Tribe's other brace of counters in the losing game. Then came the down-pour and cessation of hostilities.
