

SPAIN WORRIES SOUTH FRANCE

Border Area Is Critical of American Policy.

TOULOUSE, France, June 13.—Spain and Syria are uppermost in the minds of people here in southwestern France, while Paris is primarily concerned with Syria and the French zone of occupation in Germany.

This area, which borders on Spain, is far more concerned with the Spanish question than with Germany, which seems here a dead issue. I have just spent two days touring this area. I found everywhere the same question: "When are we going to rid Spain of fascism?"

The question is sharpened at this time by the arrival here of more than 3000 Spaniards released from German concentration camps. They are men who either escaped from Spain after the civil war, having fought on the republican side, or people who found life in Franco Spain intolerable.

The French cabinet, on June 4, extended French protectorate to them and the regional commissioner for southwestern France, Bertaux, a former professor at Toulouse university, is establishing a Spanish town for them in a now deserted German camp outside Toulouse.

Refugee Papers Banned
Up to a few months ago these Spanish refugees were able to lead a fairly active political life, but the French government has now banned all six Spanish newspapers, which appeared in Toulouse after France's liberation, and has prohibited Spaniards from any political activity.

The French in this region, fairly universally in sympathy with anti-Franco Spaniards, resent these bans and many blame them on American policy.

They also blame the U. S. and Britain for Franco's continued tenure of office.

Without Spanish and British support, they say, Franco would be forced out of office tomorrow. Now that Germany is defeated they fail to see why it should be necessary for the allies to appease Franco.

Here, also, feeling against the British runs high over the Syrian question, perhaps partly because the people are annoyed with the British over Spain. They think that fear of Russia, plus Anglo-American oil interests, has played a large role in the Syrian affair.

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NAZI PHOTOGRAPHS SHOWN AT BLOCK'S

A showing of Nazi photographs, captured by Americans from the Germans, will remain at the Wm. H. Block Co. auditorium through Saturday.

The pictures which were intended for Nazi archives are viewed by 500 persons daily, according to the Marion county chapter of American War Mothers, who are acting as hostesses.

L. C. Duckworth, district commander of the American Legion, pointed out that the exhibit was timely in view of the preparations of the allied war crimes commission to prosecute those responsible for atrocities in Europe.

"These photographs show the nature of the enemy we fought and why they must be punished for their acts of barbarism," he stated.

YOUR G. I. RIGHTS... By Douglas Larsen

G. I.'s, Formerly in U. S. Jobs, May Apply to Civil Service

WASHINGTON, June 13.—Here are some general questions from veterans and relatives on their G. I. rights:

Q—My son received an artificial leg more than a year ago. He has earned to get around on it very well. But lately he has been having trouble with it and while it is being repaired he can't get around. Is there some way he can get a new one or a spare?

A—Yes. If the artificial limb he has now isn't working properly he can get a new one from Veterans Administration, and can get a spare in addition.

Q—I live in Maine and my son recently went into the service. He is 14 years old. I received a letter from him saying he is going to get married to a girl he met near his camp in North Carolina. Can he get married without my permission? He can't in this state.

A—In North Carolina, both parties to a marriage contract need be only 18 years of age to obtain license to marry without parents' consent.

Q—I am a former federal employee discharged from the army. To whom should I apply for re-employment?

A—Go to the personnel office of the agency which you left to enter the army. If that agency has been abolished, or for some reason you can't get reinstated, apply to the nearest office of the


