**BITTER FACTS
GIVEN JAPANESE****OWI Makes Certain People
Know of Atomic Bomb.**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 9. — The Japanese are getting from us all the essential facts about our atomic bomb.

Within the limits of radio, they are receiving as much factual news about the weapon as are American newspaper readers.

The Office of War Information which is beaming the story to the enemy, and also preparing pamphlets for dropping on Jap islands, has not "hopped up" the story. It figures, it doesn't have to.

It has reason to hope that even

the Japs recognize that this is the greatest news of our generation, and that they are feeling the final results.

The broadcasts point out that the Potsdam ultimatum for unconditional surrender was issued to save the Japs from this bomb. And implicit in the broadcasts is the information that there was no time limit on that surrender ultimatum—except as one is fixed by the Japs themselves. The OWI is letting them know that they can surrender this minute, if they want to avoid further destruction.

The OWI broadcasts, made in suitable languages for peoples all the way from Siberia to southeast Asia, have given as much as possible of the texts of official government statements issued here, in London and in the Pacific.

These broadcasts have delivered to Jap radio sets practically all of President Truman's original announcement.

They have followed up with ex-

cerpts from the war department statements, parts of newspaper editorials, and comments from leaders.

Pamphlets by Millions
As soon as the text of President Truman's statement was available it was sent to Saipan, where OWI has a press capable of printing a million pamphlets a day. These pamphlets are already being distributed to fliers in the Mariannas, Manila and China, and will be dropped on Jap islands.

Reactions from enemy radios prove that our OWI programs can be heard in Japan, and lately American ships standing just off the shore of Japan have reported that medium-wave U. S. stations can be heard well in that area.

There were about 5,000,000 medium-wave radio receiving sets in Japan before the war.




