Edward Harris, former "top" sergeant on Lt. Gen. Jonathan M. Wainwright's staff at Ft. Riley, Kas., died yesterday in the Veterans' hospital here. Retired from the army since 1932, Mr. Harris, who was 60, died at 215 E. 15th st. and formerly at 3135 Ruckle st.
