

MAN, 76, STRUCK BY CAR, KILLED

Brings City Traffic Death Toll to 56.

A 75-year-old Indianapolis man was killed and five persons were injured in traffic accidents yesterday. Henry C. Lohman, 76, of 2521 E. 10th st., died in a City ambulance last night after he was hit by a car driven by Patrick Woods, 52, of 3733 E. 25th st., at 16 st. and Roosevelt ave.

According to police reports, Mr. Lohman apparently fell into the path of the car receiving a fractured skull.

His death brings the total city fatalities for the year to 56 and for both the city and county to 85.

Retired Machinist

A life resident of Indianapolis, Mr. Lohman had been a woodworking machinist before his retirement 10 years ago. Surviving him are a son, Richard H. Lohman; four daughters, Mrs. Hazel Sanders, Mrs. Rita Hoffmann, Mrs. John Wilson and Mrs. Howard Archer; a brother, Louis Lohman, and a sister, Mrs. Louise Gunneman, all of Indianapolis.

A test pilot for Allison's, Orville R. (Pinky) Grimes, 40, of 114 S. High School rd., received slight injuries when the car he was driving failed to make a turn early today on the Rockville rd., according to police reports.

The car struck a telephone pole in the 4200 block on Rockville rd., where the accident occurred, breaking the pole off and tearing down wires which served a large community. The car was described as a total wreck.
