**SCHOOL CLOSED IN
INFLUENZA EPIDEMIC**

WARSAW, Ind., Nov. 27 (U. P.).—An influenza epidemic in Kosciuszko county has closed one school and caused 630 students and teachers to miss classes, county school officials announced today.

Etna Green public schools closed a week ago and will not open for another week, officials said. A survey showed that an average of 35 to 50 students were reported ill in more than a dozen schools in the county.

FATHER SHOTS 3 CHILDREN, HIMSELF

ADA, Okla., Nov. 27 (U. P.).—Robert W. Pierce, 40, took his three small children for a Sunday automobile ride, shot them to death one by one, then turned the gun on himself, police said today.

The bodies of Pierce, Emily, 9, Janette, 7, and 4-month-old Bobby were found yesterday, lying on a blanket which had been spread neatly in a small grove of trees 300 yards from the family's parked car. All four had been shot in the head.

Police Chief Dudley Lester said Pierce apparently had shot the older children and then the baby. His own body lay across Emily's and Janette's.

Mrs. Pierce, distraught over the

tragedy, said her husband had been a railroad dispatcher until last week when illness had forced him to resign. She said he had not appeared disconsolate, however.
