## SCHOOL CLOSED IN INFLUENZA EPIDEMIC

WARSAW, Ind., Nov. 27 (U. P.)

An influenza epidemic in Kosciusko county has closed one school and caused 630 students and teachers to miss classes, county school officials announced today.

Etna Green public schools closed a week ago and will not open for another week, officials said. A survey showed that an average of 35 to 50 students were reported ill in more than a dozen schools in the county.
