


One, two and five-cent Roosevelt memorial stamps have already appeared.

**LAST JAP PRISONERS  
LEAVE U. S. TODAY**

WASHINGTON, Jan. 9 (U. P.)—The last Japanese prisoners of war in the United States are scheduled to sail for Hawaii and Japan today from two West Coast ports.

The largest group of 441 able-bodied prisoners will sail from Los Angeles for Ft. Shafter, Hawaii, where they will be used for essential labor.

A second group of 182 "non-workers," mostly officers and non-commissioned officers, will leave Seattle for Japan.

A total of 5431 Japanese war prisoners was interned in the U. S. at one time, the army said. Of these, 2586 already are doing essential work in Hawaii.
