Invalid Girl Who Wrote to Hundreds of Soldiers Dies

Hundreds of servicemen numbered among her favorite correspondents throughout the world, received a last "goodby" from Wilma Elizabeth Meece.

Confined to a wheel chair since she was 2 years old, Wilma died last night at her home, 1361 Oliver ave. She was 14.

A paralysis victim, she had spread her captivating cheer in letters to hundreds of world-wide correspondents. Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Bert Meece, said that Wilma Elizabeth was eager to meet her correspondents, never once considering her physical condition.

The Rev. E. P. White, pastor of the Trinity Methodist church, of which she was a member, will conduct services at 2 p. m. Friday.

Besides the parents, a brother, Gilbert Meece, survives her.
