ROAD TO LINK TIPTON WITH NOBLESVILLE

NOBLESVILLE, Ind., July 1. (U. P.)—Burl Lilly, district state highway superintendent, revealed that a survey for a new state highway between Noblesville and Tipton was being made.

The route will be known as road 39 and will extend north of Noblesville through Cicero, Arcadia and Atlanta to Tipton.

A section of the highway north of Tipton has been under construction for several months and will be opened for traffic by September, Mr. Lilly said.



Kidnaped Manufacturer Seizes Abductor's Gun and Escapes

PHILADELPHIA, July 1 (U. P.)—A Long Island garment manufacturer escaped from two kidnapers early today after grabbing their gun and threatening them after they forced him to halt his car at a North Philadelphia gasoline station.

The two men, sought by police of 11 states and by the federal bureau of investigation, fled when their victim, Michael Reiter, took a gun from one of the men and tried to fire. The gun failed to go off but the kidnapers drove off in Mr. Reiter's car.

Mr. Reiter was robbed of \$200 in cash and the men ransacked his apartment in Forest Hills, Long Island. They took three suitcases full of clothing and other personal belongings and, after dropping Reiter at Philadelphia, escaped in his automobile.

An 11-state alarm was sent out for the two men and FBI agents said if they are apprehended they would be charged with violation of the Lindbergh law, which carries the death penalty.

Mr. Reiter was driving his automobile in Manhattan when he stopped for a traffic light at 11:30 p. m., and the two men suddenly opened the door and entered the car. Both were armed.

ECONOMIC COUNCIL CONSULTANTS NAMED

Kenneth L. Schellie, director of the Indiana economic council, has announced appointment of Raymond L. Pike of Indianapolis and Sam Stout of Middletown as special consultants to the council.
