H. G. Wells Makes Attack Against British Royal Family

LONDON, July 5 (U. P.).—H. G. Wells, nearing his 80th birthday but still itching for a fight, today launched a savage attack upon the British royal family.

He called for investigation of what he said were rumors that it was linked with the British black-shirt movement of Sir Oswald Mosley.

Writing in the weekly Socialist Leader, organ of the independent labor party, he proposed that "some district in America where the people appear hungry for uniforms and titles should be made into a royal reserve for the various courts in exile."

"Genuine democratic communities," Mr. Wells wrote, "throughout the world need to know what's going on in this hushed business of the huge Mosley funds and how far our own royal family is involved in this affair."

"If it is involved then there is every reason why the House of Hanover should follow the House of Savoy into the shadows of exile."

Mr. Wells said that "50 years ago I was the only English republican alive . . . but now the whole world is going republican."

Almost Unprecedented
Mr. Wells' attack on the British monarchy was almost unprecedented and his suggestion of a link with British Fascist party—outlawed during the war—was the first, at least in public, which had ever been made.

Mr. Wells asserted that the British monarchy was the antithesis of democracy and contrary to all world-wide trends.

"Even this German-ruled—or is it English?—monarchy of ours which links the English with the crumbling monarchist system of the world is menaced by gathering revelations."

Bound to Appear
"Things are coming out and they are bound to come out. Why cannot these tainted people do the same and patriotic thing while they may still be treated with consideration?"

Mosley had last been in the public eye earlier this month when the government announced in the house of commons June 6 that Mosley had been revealed to have accepted a gift of about \$250,000 from Benito Mussolini in January, 1934.

However, there was no suggestion that the royal family had any connections with the movement.

TRACES TOKYO PLOT TO GRAB MANCHURIA
TOKYO, July 5 (U. P.).—A witness in the war crimes trial today accused at least three defendants of plotting to attack Manchuria in September, 1931, for the purpose of eventually placing all of Manchuria under Japanese rule.

Maj. Gen. Ryukichi Tanaka, once former Premier Hideki Tojo's personal enemy on the imperial general staff, named Dr. Shumei Okawa, Col. Kingoro Hashimoto, Gen. Seishiro Itagaki and other defendants as responsible for the Manchurian aggression.

The defendants met his accusations with icy defiance and hate-filled stares.

Tanaka's testimony came after the prosecution introduced documents purporting to show each of the 27 defendants was involved in a series of interlocking plots aimed at establishing Japanese dominance in Eastern Asia and eliminating occidental influence from that part of the world.
