H. G. Wells Makes Attack  
Against British Royal Family

LONDON, July 5 (U. P.)—H. G. Wells, nearing his 80th birthday but still itching for a fight, today launched a savage attack upon the British royal family.

He called for investigation of what he said were rumors that it was linked with the British black-shirt movement of Sir Oswald Mosley.

Writing in the weekly Socialist Leader, organ of the independent labor party, he proposed that a royal reserve be made in some districts in America where the people appear hungry for uniform and titles should be made into a royal reserve for the various courts in exile.

"Genuine democratic communists . . . are the tradition of Oliver Cromwell, Milton, Shelley and the regicides who dealt with the treacheries and treason of King Charles I."

Mr. Wells said that "50 years ago I was the only English republican alive . . . but now the whole world is going republican." Almost Unprecedented Mr. Wells' attack on the British monarchy was almost unprecedented and his suggestion of a link with British Fascist party—outlawed during this affair.

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Tanaka's testimony came after the prosecution introduced documents purporting to show each of the 27 defendants was involved in a series of interlocking plots aimed at establishing Japanese dominance in Eastern Asia and eliminating occidental influence from that part of the world.

## TYPHOID DEATHS DECLINE

CHICAGO, July 5 (U. P.)—The American Medical association reported today the typhoid death rate in 93 U. S. cities has declined steadily since 1942.
