## COMEBACK IS HARD— Dope Addicts Denied 'Stuff' Are Tortured

Only a dope addict knows the misery and mental torment of being without the "stuff."

A 39-year-old former waitress, normally, an attractive blonde, tossed from side to side in her bed. The shades were drawn in the room of a north side apartment, home of a sympathetic friend who is helping the woman to get her footing on the "comeback trail."

The haggard victim was suffering from "withdrawal pains," those agonizing, unpredictable stabs that come when the body no longer receives the sedative it has come to expect.

She had allowed herself to be brought into municipal court Wednesday so that she might be the state's principal witness against five addicts, one of whom, she said, started her on her way to broken health and torment.

Unable to walk more than a few steps at a time, the tormented witness in almost inaudible monotone related to Judge Joseph M. Howard how James (Bowling Green Jim) Wooden, 54-year-old confessed addict and peddler, had urged her to "try a little of this stuff, it'll make you feel good."

Back in her bed, where she is visited twice daily by her physician, the prematurely-aged victim related the sequence of a broken love affair, ill health and then the promise of something that would "make her feel good again."

Later, she told Wooden, who was a resident of the same apartment, that she was going to give herself up.

"I couldn't go on with the stuff. I had been taking it for the last eight months," she said.

"He told me not to do it; he said he could get me off the junk and I wouldn't be sick," the woman whispered, her face glistening with perspiration. "But, I was afraid of myself. So, I made arrangements to go to a sanitarium."

She cried softly. The narcotics case had broken here before she could follow the plan.

Unable to eat because of nausea—she has been living on orange juice the last 10 days—the frail ex-addict looks to the day when life actually "will begin at 40."

NO LONGER will she be haunted by ever-constant dreams, peopled by imaginary faces and made terrifying by grotesque shapes.

"All that silly stuff—it kinda worries me. I wonder if it all goes with getting off the stuff. Oh, this stomach of mine. It jumps and I shake all the time," the distressed victim whimpered. Then she closed her eyes and drifted into a restless, tortured sleep.


