ignored. The child was delivered three hours after the first call by a private physician.

Dr. Myers explained that the attendant responsible for turning down the call unless a fee of \$65 was paid was acting contrary to his instructions.

He explained that the fee is provided by law to be paid by non-residents of the city because "we must serve our own citizens first."

Entirely Wrong

Charges aimed at City Hospital by Assistant Fire Chief R. A. McKinney yesterday were unfounded, Dr. Myers contended. Chief McKinney charged that a fireman injured in a recent fire was refused admittance to the hospital although subsequent examinations proved the fireman had a broken leg.

"This is entirely wrong," Dr. Myers stated. "The fireman walked in, was treated and released. He was told to return if he thought he felt ill." He pointed out that the fireman had a chipped bone in one leg which showed up in a later X-ray.

Dr. Myers displayed duplicates of admission cards showing that no questions were asked concerning financial status of the injured fireman before treatment as also charged by Chief McKinney.

Dr. Myers said he welcomed a proposed visit by Fire Chief Harry Fulmer and Assistant Chief Otto Petty to explain the policies of the hospital to them.

low, the names of Crump ticket, including Senator Kenneth D. McKellar and Gov. Jim McComb. They wanted no mistakes.

Significant of the atmosphere of one-man rule also were other things. The polling places were completely plastered with big posters of the Crump ticket and at many polling places the election managers and the clerks wore cardboard ribbons of the Crump ticket.

Workers for the Crump ticket stood right at the door of the polling places, with the air of being completely in charge, handing out Crump sample ballots in violation of the law that requires them to stand at least 50 feet away.

Crump Is the Law

The whole thing was brazen. Mr. Crump is the law. And it looked as if he had taken over the whole show—which, of course, he had.

There was no evidence that anybody else was running but the Crump candidates, except in a few cases where the opposition watchers wore cardboard ribbons carrying the names of Edward W. Carmack and Gordon Browning, candidates for senator and governor, respectively.

Patrolmen in plain clothes sat inside some polling places in violation of the law, ready to do whatever was necessary to carry out the wishes of their boss, including ejection of watchers. Deputy sheriffs of Shelby county also were mixing in wherever needed.

Effects Are Wide

What goes on in Memphis is important because through this Memphis machine Boss Crump controls the state and also exercises an influence in the nation through some of Tennessee's representatives in congress. He also has an influence in national conventions of the Democratic party.

Therefore the negation of democracy in this city has its effects far afield.

are dropping by citing a reduction of 815,000 passengers in the first six months of this year compared with the same period in 1945.

He asserted that the company's equipment traveled 444,000 more car miles in the first half of this year compared with the first half

of last and that its employees also worked 61,000 more hours.

If the 8 1/2-cent rate is collected during the remainder of this year, he testified, net operating income could not exceed \$359,000 for the entire year. This would be insufficient to meet the company's estimate of what it should pay as fair return to its owners, he said.

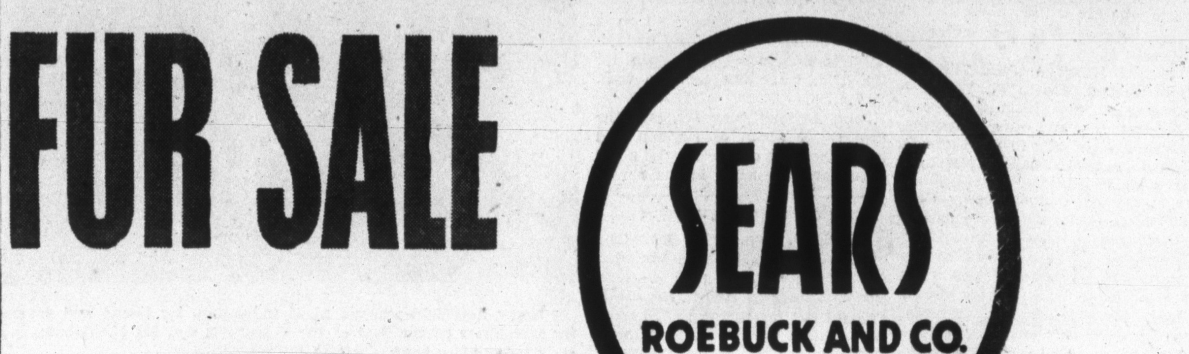

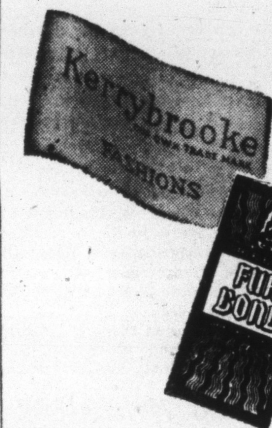

pital three hours after the blast, but physicians said their condition was "good."

Three other employees, Mark Lee, Herbert Hunt and Fred Chapman, were released from the hospital after treatment for superficial injuries.

Maynard C. Wheeler, vice president in charge of production, and the first plant official to reach the scene, said the five injured employees were the only persons in the building when the explosion occurred.

Firemen brought the blaze under control two hours after they arrived.

The blast occurred at 4:52 a. m. (C.D.T.), while a small shift of night employees was on duty at the big plant along the Wabash river.

Witnesses said the building blew up with a roar. A ball of fire rose 100 feet in the air, debris was blown into the streets, and glass from windows in nearby buildings shattered to the ground.

The sound of the explosion woke sleeping residents 17 blocks away.
