URGES U. S. PROBE SHORTAGE OF SOAP

CHICAGO, Oct. 3 (U.P.)—Rep. Emily Taft Douglas (D., Ill.) called today for a federal investigation to solve the "puzzle" of the missing soap and soap chips.

Mrs. Douglas said she had urged the inquiry in letters to Secretary of Agriculture Clinton P. Anderson and OPA administrator Paul Porter. Manufacturers may be withholding their soap products in hope of boosting prices, she said.

"I do not charge that this is true," she said, "but the shortage puzzles me."

Soap manufacturers are being allotted the same amount of fats and oils as in the past, she said, and the high rate of animal slaughtering during July and August should have added large amounts of fats for soap.

TOBACCO FORTUNE GOES TO CHARITIES

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C., Oct. 3 (U.P.)—Five million dollars of an \$8 million estate left by the late Mrs. Kate Biting Reynolds '78, of Winston-Salem, will go to religious, charitable and education institutions, her will disclosed today.

Mrs. Reynolds, wife of William Reynolds, a co-founder of the R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Co., placed approximately \$5 million of the estate in bequests.

The residue went into perpetual trust with the income to be devoted to Winston-Salem and Forsyth county needs, and to charity patients of North Carolina hospitals.

Dated July 26, 1934, the will probated in Superior court here also made bequests to her husband, and other relatives, friends, former employees, and servants, totaling over 100.

COAST GUARD 'HELIO' SAVES FLORIDANS

CLEFISTON, Fla., Oct. 3 (U.P.)—A coast guard helicopter plucked two stranded Floridians out of the swampy, almost inaccessible Everglades last night. They had been marooned since Monday.

Surveyor Cyril Baldwin and Dr. James Armstrong, Miami dentist, were stranded deep in the tangled jungle when their glades buggy, an amphibious half-track, broke down. Ensign John R. Mackey, Norfolk, Va., went to the scene yesterday with a helicopter from the St. Petersburg coast guard station. The couple had been spotted from an airplane.

ATOM POWER PLANTS SEEN POSSIBILITY

BOSTON, Oct. 3.—Million-kilowatt atomic-power plants were seen as a future possibility by A. C. Klein of Stone & Webster Engineering Corp., in an address here before the meeting of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

These first plants, he said, will be operated only by the largest consumers of power, as part of an interconnected network of several public utility systems. It will be at least 10 years, he predicted, before notable effects on current costs will be felt.

Special entertainment also is a feature of the program. After that Forest Manor residents will see, instead of steel, their home for the first time since the establishment of that community.
