## Discharge Photostats OK for Terminal Leave Pay Requests

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3.—The war department has reversed itself twice on the matter of exactly what papers have to be attached to applications for terminal-leave pay. At first it was decided that if a man had lost his original discharge paper he would have to apply for a special paper called a Certificate in Lieu of Discharge. This would have had to be accompanied with certified photostatic copies of the veteran's discharge, to supply additional information. Then it was discovered that applications for "CILS" would swamp the war department, so it was decided to accept applications accompanied by certified photostats from veterans who had lost originals. For some reason the war department's accounting office reversed that decision, and for a short time the regulations stood as previously announced.

Finally, the last decision was made and the requirement for "CILS" was dropped. And the war department went further by permitting photostats of discharges to be used even if the originals weren't lost. The first change was made just before the application blanks were printed. So when the last decision was made no change in the original blank was necessitated. Thus, as it stands now, the regulations say: "The complete form, which must be notarized by an official authorized by law to administer oaths, should be mailed, together with the discharge certificate, or a photostatic copy, certificate in lieu of lost or destroyed certificate, or a certified copy of the discharge certificate to the appropriate army, navy or marine corps or coast guard paying officer at the address listed

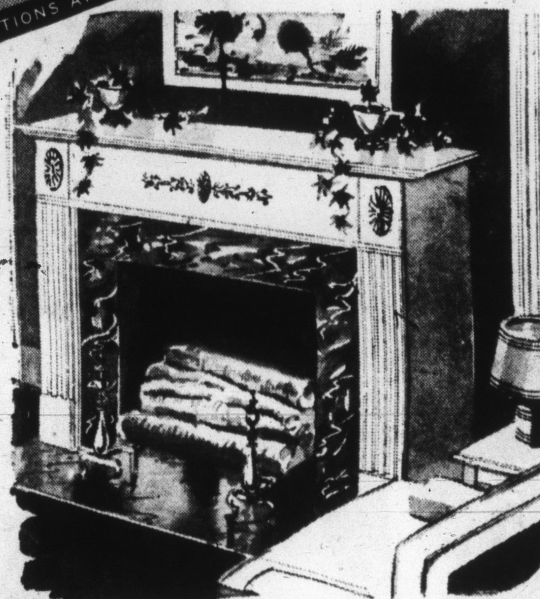

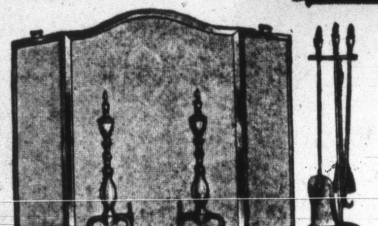

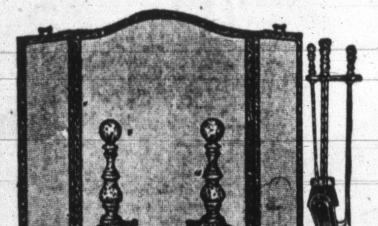
