Protestant Churches Arrange to Hold World-Wide Communion Tomorrow

PROTESTANTS around the globe will receive the sacrament in World-Wide Communion services tomorrow.

The observance will begin in New Zealand at 6 p. m. today (Indianapolis time). Continuing around the earth, as the sun mounts in the sky, services will be held in Australia, Japan, the Philippines, China, India, Paris, Russia, Egypt, South Africa, Germany, Italy, the British Isles, South America, New York, across the United States and in the Hawaiian Islands.

MINDFUL of the communion's message of sacrifice, Mr. and Mrs. Robert C. Spears will make a memorial gift of gold candlesticks to the North Methodist church at the 10:45 a. m. service. The candlesticks will be presented in honor of the Spears' son, Lt. Robert Spears, and Lt. Benjamin Fricke both of whom made the supreme sacrifice in the war.

E. J. Fricke, the late lieutenant's father, will give the presentation address. Fred Hoke will accept for the congregation. Dr. Dallas L. Browning will conduct the service assisted by the Rev. Howard Lyle, superintendent of Goodwill Industries.

THROUGHOUT the Methodist denomination, the offering will be dedicated to the Fellowship of Suffering and Service for overseas relief. The money will be used to restore churches and missions marred or destroyed by the war.

At the Washington Street Methodist church, the Rev. Almon J. Coble will celebrate the communion and among the communicants will be Mrs. Carl Bentley who married Mr. Bentley in a Methodist church in Preston-Lancaster, England in 1945. He came home in November 1945 and she joined him here the past summer. The Rev. Mr. Coble is chairman of the international peace and good will committee of the church federation.
