Support Belief Man Lived in America 25,000 Years Ago

WASHINGTON, Oct. 24. — New evidence piles upon old to support the claim that man has inhabited North America for about 25,000 years.

This date is strongly suggested in two dispatches received simultaneously from the Escuela Nacional de Antropologia e Historia in Mexico City and from the University of California at Berkeley.

The Mexican find consists of a flaked stone artifact nestled close to the skull of a giant elephant. It was turned up by Senor A. V. R. Arellano of the National University of Mexico.

Perished in Marsh
Numbers of bones in the find suggest that a herd of these elephants had been driven into the marshy edge of a lake where they bogged down and perished.

Date assigned to the stratum is of the closing period of the pleistocene ice age, which may be as much as 25,000 years ago.

The California find was actually made a couple of weeks ago near the town of Concord, but it has been given a date only now, by two University of California soil scientists, R. Earl Storie and Frank Har- radine.

The age of the nine skeletons in the group burial is given as from 5000 to 8000 years.

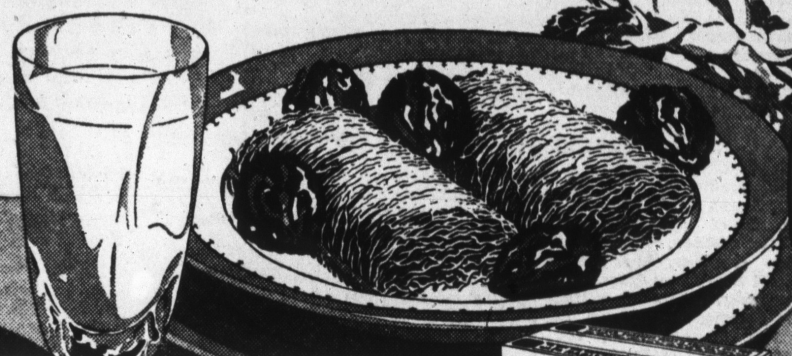
However, two still older culture layers were uncovered at Sacramento several years ago. The older of these may possibly be shoved into the 25,000-year bracket, because the

middle layer is now believed to be as much as 15,000 years old. Previous evidence points to a 25,000-year age for evidence of human occupancy in the Sandia cave near Albuquerque, N. M.

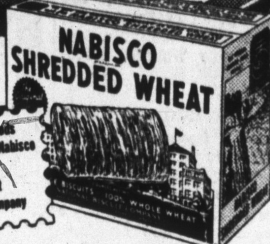
Somewhat less antiquity, perhaps 20,000 years, is claimed for the skull found near Melbourne, Fla.
