WATER LEVEL FALLS THROUGHOUT INDIANA

Although no serious water shortages have been reported, officials of the state conservation department said today that lake water levels in Indiana have been on the decline for the past two months.

During September, they said, Hoosier lakes declined 0.2 feet.

Conservation officers said stream flow has averaged about 50 per cent of normal throughout the state, and rainfall was generally less than 50 per cent of normal for the month.

The state's water resources investigation division recently reported that 82 observation wells showed net declines during September, and the remaining 13 showed slight rises.
