WATER LEVEL FALLS THROUGHOUT INDIANA

Although no serious water shortages have been reported, officials of the state conservation department said today that lake water levels in Indiana have been on the decline for the past two months. During September, they said, Hoosier lakes declined 0.2 feet. Conservation officers said stream flow has averaged about 50 per cent of normal throughout the state, and rainfall was generally less than 50 per cent of normal for the month. The state's water resources investigation division recently reported that 82 observation wells showed net declines during September, and the remaining 13 showed slight net rises.

Preview of U. S. Weather Bureau Forecast for Period Ending 7:30 AM EST 10-25-46



NATIONAL 24-HOUR FORECAST SUMMARY: It will be mild throughout the eastern third of the U. S. Thursday evening with night temperatures at a higher level in the Atlantic states. The Gulf states will enjoy mild weather also. Skies will be clear over the North and Middle Atlantic states, but cloudiness will develop further west where an advancing cold front will occasion numerous showers and thunderstorms. Northwest of the front there will be thundershowers in Michigan, Indiana and Illinois; also, in parts of Wisconsin and Iowa. However, the Plains states will experience clearing and cooler weather as the front moves southward. And, it will clear in

the affected areas shown on the FOTOCAST by sometime Friday. Partly cloudy skies with little change in temperature is the indication for the Gulf states. It will be cooler west of the cold front in Texas by Thursday night, and in the Plains states, western Great Lakes region, upper and central Mississippi valleys, Rockies and most western states. Southern California and Utah temperatures will not be affected by the change to cooler indicated elsewhere in the west. Scattered showers are pictured for the central Missouri and Mississippi valleys, Plains states and Montana. Shower development over the mountains in Wyoming, Colorado, Idaho and Montana will take the form of snow flurries.

Rainfall is expected in northern Idaho, Washington state and northern Oregon, where a cold front of Pacific origin will move inland. There should be clearing skies, however, Thursday night for light local frost is predicted in Washington, Oregon and northern California by Friday morning. The Rockies will enjoy fair and cooler weather except where occasional rain or showers are indicated.

Mr. DuKate died yesterday in his home, 907 N. Keystone ave. He was 66. A native of Fayette county, he had been employed by the E. C. Atkins Co. for one year. Survivors are his wife, Lena; two sons, Paul and Howard DuKate, and a daughter, Mrs. Fred A. Shugert, all of Indianapolis, and a brother, Omer G. DuKate, Rocky Ford, Colo.

CONSIDER 3 JUDGES FOR POLLARD TRIAL

Three possible special-judges were being considered today to hear the case of Howard Pollard, charged with the "hands and foot" slaying of Leland Paul Miller.

They are Walter Todd, William B. Miller and Isador Feibelman, all Indianapolis attorneys. The state supreme court clerk certified them yesterday after defense attorneys had exercised their legal right of obtaining a change of venue from Judge William D. Bain of criminal court.

According to legal procedure, one of the trio will be eliminated by the prosecutor. Another will be eliminated by the defense. The remaining attorney will be asked to serve as special judge.

Miller's charred body was found last spring in the ruins of a Montgomery county cabin. His severed hands and feet were found on a creek bank in Boone county.
