Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and Dr. Ralph W. Sockman Principal Speakers for Climactic Nov. 12 Meeting

Indianapolis Protestants, Catholics and Jews will be hosts to the 31st annual meeting of the World Alliance for International Friendship Through the Churches Nov. 10, 11 and 12.

"Our World Is One World"

is the theme scheduled to highlight the entire conference which will deal with religion and world order. Approximately 60 persons of note in the nation will come to Indianapolis to speak or attend the sessions. Many local organizations of all faiths are sponsors. Chief among these is the church federation's committee on international justice and goodwill and its chairman, the Rev. Almon J. Coble.
