Indianapolis Churches of All Faiths to Be Hosts for 3-Day World Friendship Conference

Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and Dr. Ralph W. Sockman Principal Speakers for Climactic Nov. 12 Meeting

Indianapolis Protestants, Catholics and Jews will be hosts to the 31st annual meeting of the World Alliance for International Friendship Through the Churches Nov. 10, 11 and 12.

"Our World Is One World" is the theme scheduled to highlight the entire conference which will deal with religion and world order. Approximately 60 persons of note in the nation will come to Indianapolis to speak or attend the sessions. Many local organizations of all faiths are sponsors. Chief among these is the church federation's committee on international justice and goodwill and its chairman, the Rev. Almon J. Coble.

Climactic Meeting Nov. 12

Speakers will fill the pulpits of local churches on Sunday, Nov. 10, and address noon luncheons Nov. 11 and 12 in the Columbia club. Sessions will be held Monday, Nov. 11, in the Roberts Park Methodist church and next day in the war memorial building.

The climactic meeting will be Nov. 12 at 8 p. m. in the World War Memorial auditorium when Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and Dr. Ralph W. Sockman will be the principal speakers. Charles A. Breece, president of the church federation, will preside. Rabbi Wise of New York is the founder of the Zionist Organization of America. Dr. Sockman, also of New York, is pastor of Christ Methodist church.
