RETARDS FIRE, HEAT

The liquid is ethyl silicate, use of which was reported to the American Chemical Society by H. D. Cogan and C. A. Setterstrom of the Mellon Institute of Industrial Research here.

Pigments to be used with ethyl silicate include ochre, sienna, chromium oxide, iron oxide, titanium oxide for white and carbon black for black.






