**'Unusual' Is the Word for Robeson's Concert at I. U.**

BLOOMINGTON, Ind., Nov. 22.—Paul Robeson sang an unusual concert here last night.

It was unusual for the fact that it had the largest audience ever to hear a concert in the Indiana university auditorium. Special extra seats had been added in the orchestra pit.

It was unusual for the fact that Mr. Robeson sang duets with his piano accompanist, Lawrence Brown. Mr. Brown was not only the arranger of some of the numbers on the program, but he sang a tenor contrast to Mr. Robeson in four spirituals.

Unusual was the fact Mr. Robeson sang into a dummy microphone.

There was an unusual political overture to the concert. Although Mr. Robeson's manager had pledged him not to make any political speech, some of his music fitted the left-wing line. There was one anti-British number, one anti-France one, two "fighting songs for the land of our brave ally, Russia," and one in praise of the American proletariat.

Extraordinary was the fact that a musical recital should close by a recitation of Shakespearean drama. Yet the audience was pleased that Mr. Robeson should choose to end his concert by reading the curtain speech of "Othello," a role Mr. Robeson played on the stage two years ago.

Most important of all, Mr. Robeson has an unusual voice—unusual in richness, unusual in tone. Last night's program displayed that voice in an unusual variety of music—old English and old Italian songs, opera, oratorio, Jewish chant, spirituals, folk songs, musical comedy. (S.E.H.)
