STOUT FIELD WAITS 28 MORE FAMILIES

Twenty-eight more veteran housing units at the Stout Field project are expected to be ready for occupancy by the first part of next week.

Announcement of completion of the units was made by Forrest Logan, FPHA project engineer.

To date, sixty-four dwellings are occupied.

Mr. Logan said he believed the project would be finished some time in March, 1947. He said the cost of the project is expected to exceed by 40 or 50 per cent the original estimate made by the government.

Construction has been moving slowly due to a lack of plumbers on the job. Three more plumbers reported for work from the Evansville area making a total of 18 at the 374-unit project.

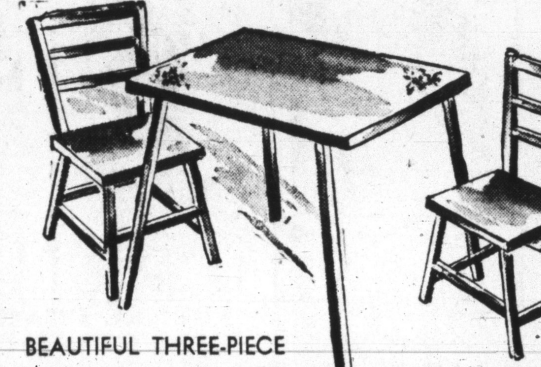

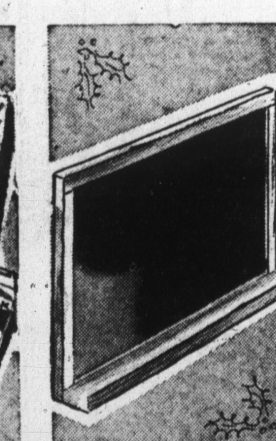
