# Caps' Early Lead Fades Away



'Line Drive' by Eddie Bush  
Handcuffs Goalie Almas and  
Flyers Gain a 3-3 Deadlock

The Indianapolis Caps last night were the victims of a line drive. They weren't playing baseball but the guess is that Eddie Bush, St. Louis Flyers' big defenseman, thought he was on a diamond instead of on hockey ice.

In the third and final period at contest played before 6188 fans and far out at mid-ice and the drive had so much on it that the blazing puck handcuffed Cap Goalie Red Almas, tore through his glove and dropped into the cage for the tying score at 3-3.

Bush's goal was registered at 18:12, just 1 minute 48 seconds before the curtain. It upset the Caps and the fans no end but was a tribute to the staying qualities of the St. Louis club.

**Flyers Keep Plugging**

As a matter of fact, the Flyers played their hockey like the St. Louis Cardinals play baseball, at least as far as this was last night despite the fact the visitors are last in the American league's western division.

At one time in the game, the Hoosiers held a 3-0 lead, shortly after the start of the second period. But the Flyers refused to fold, fought back, kept plugging and came from behind by scoring one goal in the second stanza and two in the third.

The Flyers lost the services of one player, Jack Shewchuk, a defenseman, in the second period. He received a fractured left wrist and will be out of play indefinitely. He was taken to the City hospital and in 22 starts.
