High Italian Gets Gift of Suit

ROME, Jan. 1 (U. P.).—Italian Foreign Minister Pietro Nenni can attend formal diplomatic dinners in 1947, because at last he has formal dinner clothes. They came all the way from Argentina, a gift from a friend.

The Socialist foreign minister's assistant said Mr. Nenni had declined all formal invitations since he took office two and a half months ago. Mr. Nenni's monthly salary is 35,000 lire, or about \$70 at the current black market exchange rate. Dinner clothes in Rome cost about 100,000 lire.

Justice Officials Probing Bilbo

WASHINGTON, Jan. 1 (U. P.).—Senate Republicans were expected today to pursue their attempt to oust Senator Theodore G. Bilbo (D. Miss.) without awaiting the outcome of a justice department investigation.

The justice department disclosed last night that it had been investigating Senator Bilbo's affairs for "some time." A spokesman said all phases of the case were being covered.

The inquiry was understood to cover some matters which were not touched upon by the senate committee which investigated Senator Bilbo's alleged improper dealings with war contractors and his purporting intimidation of Negroes during the Mississippi primary.

Meanwhile, the senate Republican steering committee scheduled a special holiday meeting for today to outline out-Bilbo strategy. The committee agreed unanimously to recommend that Senator Bilbo's right to a seat be challenged. The problem now, Chairman Robert A. Taft (D. O.) said, is deciding the proper method of presenting the challenge.

Bingham, acting district manager. Mr. Bingham is believed to favor establishment of a regional office in Indianapolis, to expedite surplus disposal. Under the present set-up four regional offices (Cincinnati, Chicago, Louisville and St. Louis) direct Indiana's program.

Some Want New Chief

Mr. Bingham and his supporters are understood to feel the overlapping authorities have slowed down the Indiana program and handicapped Hoosier veterans in getting their share of war surplus.

The opposing faction is rumored more interested in disposing of Mr. Bingham than of war surplus. This group, mostly old line civil service workers, are in favor of continuing under the present set-up.

Popular preference for a new chief is understood to be James Messier, assistant to Mr. Bingham and chief in charge of disposal.

The feuding has reached mud-slinging stage, it is reported. One frequently heard story is that one post was handed out because of political connections of the official's family. Mr. Bingham's wife is Edna Bingham, vice-chairman of the Democratic state central committee.
