

## Expect Short Building Strike

### Spokesmen Optimistic About Settlement

Optimism prevailed today that a strike of 100 construction laborers involving more than \$4 million in building projects here would be short-lived.

Spokesmen for both sides said a further attempt will be made soon to settle the issue, although no definite meeting time has been set. The work stoppage technically became effective Jan. 1; however, inclement weather ordinarily would have kept the union members from working.

J. C. Wilson, chairman, wage committee, Building Contractors' Association of Indianapolis, declared that "so far as I know, the strike is on, since the union (Local 124, International Hodcarriers', Building and Common Laborers' Union of America, A. F. of L.) turned down our wage offer Monday."

John Etchison, union business agent, believes the dispute can be settled by Monday. He said, he made several efforts yesterday to reach one of the association officials. Mr. Wilson added that a "meeting probably will be held today."

## Holy Land's Secret Army Ends Truce

JERUSALEM, Jan. 2 (U. P.)—Palestine was brought to the brink of new violence today.

An Irgun Zvai Leumi announcement "officially" ended the truce in the extremist sabotage campaign.

The same announcement condemned the American government for giving only "lip service" to the Zionist cause.

"On promises—even the most respectable—we cannot rely any more," the Irgun broadcast declared.

"Action, not words" was also threatened by the Arabs of Palestine, who convoked an Arab congress to meet in Jerusalem. Its decisions will be secret.

Gen. Sir Alan Cunningham, Palestine high commissioner, was to fly to London today for consultation with Colonial Secretary Arthur Creech Jones on the situation.

Troops of the British 6th airborne division hunting the Extremists who flogged four British soldiers seized four men with whips in their possession during a six-hour search in Rehovot. The troops blocked off Rehovot, a citrus garden city containing the country's largest concentration of Yemenite Jews, and made a house to house search.

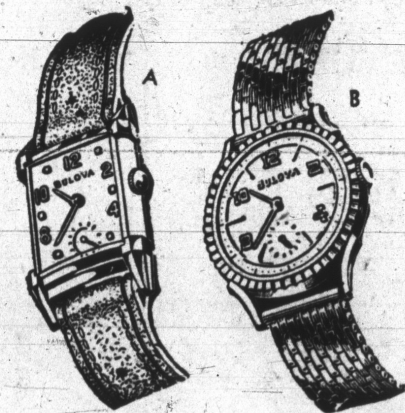
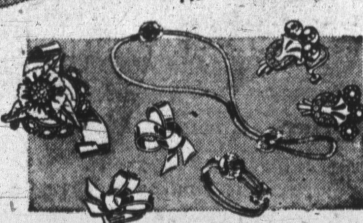
