Body of Helen Richey Found in Apartment

NEW YORK, Jan. 8 (U. P.).—An autopsy was ordered today on the body of Helen Richey, 37, pioneer American woman flier, who was found dead in her one-room furnished apartment.

The body of Miss Richey was found last night by Robert Wright, apartment superintendent. He went to her apartment at the request of friends who had been unable to reach her since 4 p. m. Sunday.

A medical examiner said an autopsy would be necessary to determine the cause of death. The body, clad in a pink nightgown, was sprawled on a neatly made-up day-bed.

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 8 (U. P.).—The new G. O. P. presidential candidate will be a dark horse, definitely not a "barfoot boy from the west," according to Col. Robert R. McCormick, Chicago Tribune publisher.

Col. McCormick made it clear by implication that his reference to "barfoot boy" went back to the Republican selection of the late Wendell Willkie for the presidential nomination in 1940.

"A man beaten once never returns," he asserted in ruling out Gov. Thomas E. Dewey's chances to bear the G. O. P. standard in 1948.
