2 Fliers Killed, 1 Motorist Dead

Casualties in the air exceeded those in automobile accidents in Indiana over the week-end, with two dead and four injured in four airplane crashes. One youth was killed and another injured in an automobile crash.

Milton C. Weber, 25, and his brother, Gerald, 21, of Monroe, Mich., were killed when they lost control of their plane in a snow-storm late Saturday and crashed on the King Farm three miles south of Ashley in DeKalb county.

Robert Shank, 30, and Nolan Mitchell, 20, both of Trafalgar, were in serious condition in Methodist hospital here after a plane crash yesterday five miles west of Trafalgar.

Injured in Ambulance

The ambulance in which Mr. Shank was being rushed to Methodist hospital last night crashed into an automobile at Capitol ave. and Michigan st.

Mr. Shank's mother, Mrs. Edna Shank, 63, of Trafalgar, suffered leg injuries in the ambulance. She was riding to the hospital with her son.

There was no immediate determination as to whether the plane crash victim's injuries were aggravated by the crash.
