**Rep. Springer's
Post to Be
Filled Nov. 4**

**Notables Pay Tribute
To Ex-Congressman**

Following funeral services for Rep. Raymond S. Springer at Connersville yesterday, Governor Ralph Gates set Nov. 4 as the date for a special election in the 10th district to elect a successor to the veteran congressman.

Senator Jenner Presides
Attending the services besides the governor were U. S. Senator William E. Jenner, Congressmen George Gillie, Earl Wilson and Forest Harness; state auditor A. V. Burch and state Republican chairman H. Clark Springer.

Senator Jenner presided at special ceremonies during which the widow, Mrs. Nancy Springer, was presented with a large American flag which had draped the congressman's bier while the body lay in state.

Loyal Public Servant

At the funeral services in the First Methodist church at Connersville, the Rev. Joseph G. Moore, pastor, eulogized Rep. Springer as a "loyal public servant and a good congressman." Burial rites at Dale cemetery were conducted by the Masonic lodge and the American Legion.

Active pallbearers were E. Ralph Himmelick, Judge Allen Wiles, Clarence S. Roots, Christian Eby, Clyde E. Berry, Henry Silvey, George Jones and George F. Tatman, all of Connersville.

Dies During 5th Term

Rep. Springer died in a hospital at Connersville Thursday night during his fifth term in Congress. He was Republican nominee for governor of Indiana in 1932 and 1936.

The election date for selection of a new representative from the 10th district will be on the same day as the state municipal balloting. All voters in counties comprising the 10th congressional district will cast ballots for congressman.

Candidates for both the Republican and Democratic parties will be nominated by the respective county chairmen in the district. The nominations will be made by Oct. 1.

No 4 Date Protested

Some Republican leaders in the district protested the Nov. 4 date for the election, contending that issues involved in the city elections would interfere with congressional balloting.

However, Governor Gates explained that holding the special election with the municipal balloting is the only logical procedure since a separate election would involve heavy expenditures.

Some of the old guard G. O. P. leaders in Washington started a boom for aging (86) James E. Watson, former U. S. senator, for the vacant house seat, but the veteran congressman said he would not be a candidate.

More than a dozen Republican leaders in the district have been mentioned for the G. O. P. nomination but no one has been listed for the top position among county chairmen.

**Woman Gets Fractured
Skull in Stairway Fall**

An East Side woman was in critical condition at City hospital today being treated for a fractured skull received when she fell down the basement stairs at a house in the 100 block on Post rd., early today.

The injured woman, Mrs. Haddie Yowier, 33, is reported as living at 302 N. Summit ave. Accompanying her at the time of the accident were three persons who identified themselves to deputy sheriffs as Alan Lynch, 20, 1520 E. Ohio st.; Paul Hanny, 21, 240 N. Summit ave., and Thelma Glenn, 24, Rushville.

**New Construction Up
5 Per Cent in August**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 2 (U. P.)—New construction begun in August of this year was 5 per cent higher than that commenced in July, the commerce department said today.

An estimated \$1,212,000 worth was begun in August. The revised July estimate was \$1,153,000.

The August figure also was a gain of nearly 15 per cent over the volume of new construction begun in August, 1946.


