Fletcher Diaries Still a Court Issue

Appellate Judges Uphold Publication

The Indiana Appellate Court has ordered Marion County Probate Court to proceed with trial of a lawsuit to force publication of the late Calvin Fletcher, pioneer Indianapolis attorney and banker.

The lawsuit, brought two years ago by the Attorney General's office against trustees of the estate of Mrs. Laura Fletcher Hodges, granddaughter of the pioneer banker, who died 25 years ago.

The suit charged that the trustees of the estate had failed to carry out terms of Mrs. Hodges' will in which she provided that her grand-father's diaries be published in book form for public distribution.

Trustees Protest

The trustees protested publication of the diaries at an estimated cost of more than \$25,000 in a demurrer filed in Probate Court more than a year ago.

The demurrer argued that publication of the diaries for a public trust was not enforceable on the estate.

Trustees of Mrs. Hodges' Estate Contended They Had Complied

Trustees of Mrs. Hodges' estate contended they had complied with terms of the will when they had typewritten copies of the diaries filed in the state archives in the Historical Bureau.

Judge Dan V. White of Probate Court upheld the trustees' demurrer. The Appellate Court reversed that decision and ordered the lower court to proceed with trial of the Attorney General's lawsuit.

The State Suit Contended the Diaries Contained Valuable Data on the Early History of Indianapolis and Indiana Between 1821 and 1866.

The petition stated that information in the diaries is not available in any other historical sources and that it should be made public.

Recess Granted In Hemmer Trial

Prosecution Requests Delay Until Monday

GREENCASTLE, Oct. 3.—The embezzlement trial of Floyd J. Hemmer, former State Penitentiary superintendent, today was recessed until Monday morning. Special Judge Robert Stewart granted the delay on request of the prosecution.

A former Greencastle assistant bank cashier, William Stiles, testified yesterday that he cashed a \$975 check for Hemmer which had been made out by the State Farm to R. P. Olinger, Huntington contractor. Mr. Stiles is now employed by a Marion bank.

Mr. Stiles said that the check carried Mr. Olinger's name as endorser and also Hemmer's.

Charged in Indictment

Mr. Olinger later testified that the signature was not his.

The canceled check, introduced Wednesday as an exhibit, showed also the name of H. P. Kunkler as second endorser. Mr. Stiles testified that the second signature looked as though it had been changed.

Mr. Kunkler testified he did not endorse the check and had never seen it before the investigation started. He was employed by Mr. Olinger.

Hemmer was charged with embezzlement in 13 indictments but was tried on only one indictment.

Gates Appoints Housing Expeditor

Orders Speedup On Construction

Gov. Gates, spurred to action by reports showing that home construction in Indiana is lagging, today appointed a state housing expeditor and ordered a vigorous campaign to speed up the house-building program.

Gov. Gates appointed Kenneth L. Schellie, director of the Indiana Economic Council, as housing expeditor. He asked Mr. Schellie to follow the recommendations of the economic council's advisory committee on housing.

The committee recently proposed a five-point program urging:

ONE: Conferences with representatives of the building industry with a view to eliminating inefficient and costly practices that delay construction and add to its cost.

TWO: Contacts with congressmen to encourage rental housing by permitting 50 per cent of cost of multi-family rental dwelling units to be depreciated during a five-year period following construction.

THREE: Discussions with the Federal Trade Commission on the problem of increasing the supply of building materials.

FOUR: Discussions to leaders of organized labor on the subject of liberalizing the apprentice system because of a shortage of building trade craftsmen.

FIVE: Conferences with officials of the state gross income tax division with a view to giving tax relief to war veterans who are buying homes.

Gov. Gates said that if Mr. Schellie could negotiate any or all of the recommendations, "it would do much to relieve the housing crisis."
